Literacy

Can you answer the following questions about the story: What sound does each animal make? Where do the animals live? What are the two bad men trying to do? How do the animals stop the two bad men from stealing the cow? What happens to the two bad men?

Maths

Sorting animals - can you build pens for your toy animals at home? Then put all animals that are the same in each pen e.g. all the pigs in one pen. It doesn't matter if you don't have enough animals for this - you can use cars, dinosaurs or whatever you have at home!

Ordering - look at the words- shortest, tallest, smallest.

Have a go and ordering toys and teddy's using the words above.

Understanding the World

The Life of a chicken - Let's have a look at the life of a chicken. First of all the chicken lays an egg. The egg must be kept warm and safe. Then after a while the egg begins to crack and the baby is called a hatchling. When the bird leaves the egg and begins to grow it is called a chick. The little chick eats lots of nutritious food and grows up to be a big chicken.

Can you have a go at drawing the different stages with someone at home? Can you think of other farm animals and how they grow to be big and strong? How about a cow or a sheep.

The Farmer - The animals wouldn't stay healthy and safe without the farmer looking after them. The farmer is a very important person on the farm. The Farmer has so many jobs to do and gets up very early to make sure they are all done. Can you think of any jobs a farmer needs to do every day?

Feed the animals Clean the pens & beds
Cut the grass Mend the fences

Milk the Cows Sheer the sheep Collect the eggs

Quick the sheep have escaped!!! - Sometimes the animals get out of their pens and run all over the farm! Ask a grown up if they can hide 10 of your toys around your home or garden and see if can find them all and return them to their pen. Be quick though we don't want a fox to catch them.

Sneaky fox - This is a fun game for 2 or more people. One person has to be the fox and the others can be different farm animals. The fox must stand facing a wall and all the other animals need to quietly sneak towards the fox and touch the wall before the fox hears you. Don't get caught!!!
