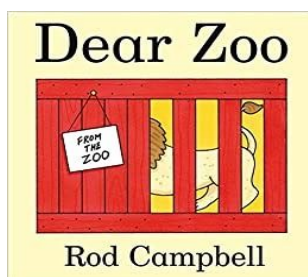

Literacy

Write/draw an information poster about your favourite character. Try and include a description of the animal, what it eats, needs to survive and draw and label pictures of the animals too!

Play 'Describe and Find It'. First, you need pictures of the animals from the story or the story from the link above on your phone/tablet/laptop. Look at the animals and ask your child to say what animal it is. Then, talk about the animals together e.g. what colour are they? How many legs do they have? do they have a tail/big ears? Are they spotty/stripey? Next, take it in turns to describe an animal and see if the other person can guess which animal it is!

Maths

Go on a number hunt together and discover where numbers are used around the house (e.g. clocks, televisions, calendars) . Can you list where you have found them or take photos?

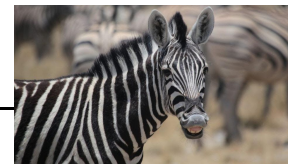
Sorting - Sorting things can be great fun. Can you sort out the socks in your washing pile. Make sure you can find the right pair.



Can you sort your toys by colour, by size, by type of toy? Ask someone at home to challenge you.
