Literacy

This week we get to find out how Roy manages to escape from the Zoo.

Can you think of ways you would escape from a Zoo if you were stuck inside one?

See if you can use these verbs to help you think of ways you would escape.

Run, Jump, Climb, Skip, Hop, Fly

Now think of who would help you escape? Would it be an animal, a friend, or a member of your family?

What objects would you use to help you escape?

Ask your child to tell you all about how they would escape prompting them to include the information above. Write down what your child says and then ask them to copy write, over write or under write their great escapes. Ask them if they draw a picture of their great escape and name the animals/ people in their picture?

In the story Roy the Zebra, the animals do lots of different movements.

- Can you pretend to lift a big plank of wood like George.
- Use your big long trunk to carry the wood just like Lucy.
- Pretend to drop a big heavy rock like Lucy.
- Next can you jump up in the air like Roy.
- Creep around but don't let anyone hear you.
- Can you sneak past the zoo keepers? But don't let them see you!

After you have had a go at all the different movements see if you can put them together to create your own animal sequence.
