3GR - Tori-Lea for settling into her new class.


3J - Crystal for excellent reading and for sharing the funny articles she found in the paper with her teachers.



WhatsApp launches new disappearing messages

During November, WhatsApp will be rolling out 'disappearing messages'. The feature will allow WhatsApp users to enable disappearing messages on chats, videos and photos. These may be called 'snaps', 'secret conversations' or 'vanishing messages'. Whilst WhatsApp's minimum user age is 16, many children and young people have accounts. They may think their messages will disappear, but they can still be saved elsewhere by whoever they send them to.

Talk to your child about the use of disappearing messages. Help them to understand the limits of disappearing messages and how almost everything posted can be saved. Help them to understand what they should and shouldn't share with others and check they know who to speak to if they run into problems online.
