Dear Parent/Guardian,

We fully commit and believe in enhancing the learning of each child in our classrooms. In addition to the diverse and rich opportunities offered through lessons, we provide opportunities for pupils to go out on trips and visits of value.

As you will read through, we use a considerable variety of educational visits and rewards trips each year. We ensure that pupils have the opportunity to experience local, regional, national and international visits, trips and residentials.

Residential trips mainly occur in school holidays and weekends so that there is minimal impact on classroom teaching and students do not miss vital academic time. The departmental visits tend to be centred around more local sites within an hour travel from school.

We recognise that cost-effective trips are important so that all trips are accessible to all pupils. A voluntary contribution is required for most departmental visits and the cost of residentials must be met by agreed deadlines.

Opportunities provided by subjects for pupils take part in also include The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. Pupils from Year 9 and Year 10 are invited to work towards their Bronze and Silver award respectively which will build new skills beyond the traditional school curriculum.

Penwortham Priory Academy has also built strong and trusted links with local colleges and our pupils are highly regarded by them. Key Stage 4 pupils are regularly offered opportunities with colleges and universities to experience a huge range of engaging and valuable masterclasses planned to give the most keen pupils a great learning experience. These are designed to provide challenging and thought-provoking sessions for pupils who will benefit from an extension to their learning outside of the school curriculum. They give

pupils the opportunity to stretch themselves and explore different subjects they may want to pursue in their future. These include programmes such as Medical Marvels, Maths Challenges, Cyber First, Cryptology Workshops and Escape Rooms, STEM, Criminology, Catering & Hospitality, Sports, and A-Level masterclass tasters, amongst many, many others. They are free and transport is usually provided without cost to parents.

International Trips

London & Paris

The English and humanities departments venture across the capitals arriving at Harry Potter Studios before moving on to Shakespeare's Globe Theatre and the London Eye. Then it's across the Channel to the world famous sites of Paris from the Eifel Tower and Montparnasse to a cruise down the Seine, topped off at the city's Disneyland.

New York

We aim to provide pupils with a true flavour of the city by completing iconic visits and experiences

from Times Square, Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island to Central Park, the Empire State Building and Ground Zero, taking in a Broadway show and Coney Island theme park. Whilst there, pupils investigate development, population increase, urban sustainability in a dynamic world and simply everything else you would expect of a dream destination!

Iceland

An amazing opportunity to study, experience and learn from the geographical beauty that is known as 'the land of fire and ice'. The trip covers exciting geographical and geological wonders from volcanoes, glaciers and hot springs to viewing whales and porpoises in their natural habitat — ensuring what students learn in the classroom is brought to life in the real and natural world.

Belgium

Pupils will embark on a poignant journey through history as we explore the WW1 battlefields of Belgium. Our adventure begins with an in-depth exploration of the Passchendaele Museum, followed by a visit to the Hill 62 trench, offering a glimpse into the soldiers' experiences. A highlight of the trip is participating in the Last Post Ceremony and laying a wreath in remembrance. Guided tours of significant war graves, including Tyne Cot and the Somme, provide a solemn and educational conclusion to this unforgettable experience
