



Marking & Feedback in Geography

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Key Stage 4

Marking

There are assessed pieces of work that are assigned to each topic to assess skills needed for the GCSE examinations. These are reviewed and agreed by GCSE staff each academic year to ensure that all classes are assessed in the same way. Pupil's responses are marked and given a numbered mark by the member of staff. Moderation of longer pieces is undertaken.

Typically, a single unit of work will comprise of several strategically agreed planned exam questions within the topic as it is taught. An end of topic/unit assessment will take place that is reflective of the GCSE paper from a previous year. This will be marked, followed by appropriate DIRT work and a Question Level Analysis feedback sheet distributed to pupils.

Feedback

As at Key Stage 3, feedback is an integral part to all lessons. Feedback comes in the form of verbal support and QLA feedback cards.
