Homework in Physical Education

Any PE homework is purposeful and support learning. It is never set for the sake of setting homework. PE homework should be accessible for all pupils. If a pupil fails to meet a homework deadline, or if homework is completed to a poor standard, a warning will be issued on Synergy in the first instance. If this happens again in the same half term, the pupil will be given a detention with the class teacher. The intention of this detention is not to be punitive but rather to support the pupil in completing the work on time and to the required standard.

What does homework look like in KS3/4 Physical Education?

All pupils can expect to receive homework assignments via Microsoft Teams which are logged for parental access on Synergy.

KS3 Homework will typically consist of:

Comprehension activities which encourage pupils to read and gain a deeper knowledge and understanding of the history and rules of sport. This takes the form of pupils reading longer pieces of formal prose in order to provide context and background, alongside developing their cultural capital. Pupils are given a piece to read out loud which they can record on Teams. Pupils develop their reading fluency, automaticity and vocabulary skills alongside contextual understanding and cultural capital of the activity being studied and of sports in general.

With the open school-policy, pupils are able to either use the Sports Hall, 3G and outdoor courts in order to practice skills and tactics learnt in lesson at breaks and lunchtimes.

KS4 homework will typically consist of:

During each unit of the GCSE or VCert curriculum, students will complete revision cards/notes. These are to be used for the end of unit tests that will be administered throughout the year.

Pupils will be given a number of long mark exam questions through each unit which will then be marked and 'green penned' in the subsequent lesson.

Students may be asked to read around topics in preparation for lessons or to broaden subject knowledge or examples around topics being covered. These will be set on Teams to allow students to record and have their reading analysed.
