

WHAT DOES HOMEWORK LOOK LIKE IN DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY?

Homework set in Design and Technology is designed to complement the curriculum and reinforce learning.

KEY STAGE 3:

The homework will be linked to the current unit of work students are currently studying in Design and Technology, but may also refer back to previous units of work to ensure students are retaining knowledge and skills previously taught. Students will receive a variety of activities such as:

- Reading and comprehension tasks
- Knowledge checks
- Online quizzes
- Recall checks
- Revision tasks

For any digital work set, students can choose to complete this work at home, or they are welcome to use the computers in the department at break times, lunch times, and after school. The teachers in the department are also available at these times if any students would like help with any tasks set.

KEY STAGE 4:

At key stage 4, students can opt to study Graphic Design and/or Engineering. The homework tasks set in these subjects follow the same format as Key Stage 3. Students will also be asked to produce revision materials in preparation for assessments and exams. This could take the format of mind maps and revision cards made using the resources and information provided to them in class.
