





GCSE Results 2024 - A Summary

The results of many individuals have shone, with their hard work and commitment rewarded with outstanding grades. The results clearly reflect the effort put in by all involved."

English

- 45% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in English
- 65% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

Maths

- 51% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in Maths
- 72% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

English and Maths

- 36% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in English and Maths
- 59% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

Furthermore

- 67% of pupils taking 2 Sciences achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass).
- 42% of pupils taking 2 Sciences achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass).
- 74% of pupils taking a Language achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass).
- 65% of pupils taking a Language achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass).
- Over 20% of pupils sitting the following subjects achieved a grade 7, 8 or 9 Art and Design, Chemistry, Physics, Geography, German and PE.
- Many vocational subjects also performed fantastically well with Dance, Childcare, Engineering, ICT Digital
 Info Tech, and Drama all demonstrating outstanding results once again.

Congratulations, first and foremost, to our students. We all know how hard it's been at times, but also how hard they have worked. They should be very proud.

Congratulations too, to everyone associated with the school; staff, parents, guardians, trustees; in supporting our young people throughout their time with us. We want to take this moment to say that what you have collectively done to get students to this point does not go unnoticed.
