English

- 60% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in English
- 74% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

Maths

- 47% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in Maths
- 70% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

English and Maths

- 39% of all pupils achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass) in English and Maths
- 61% achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass)

Furthermore

- 62% of pupils taking two Sciences achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass).
- 42% of pupils taking two Sciences achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass).
- 87% of pupils taking a Language achieved a grade 4+ (standard pass).
- 68% of pupils taking a Language achieved a grade 5+ (strong pass).
- Over 50% of pupils sitting the following subjects achieved a grade 5 to 9 – Art & Design, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, English Language, Food Preparation & Nutrition, French, Chinese and Polish, Persian and Religious Education.
- Over 30% of pupils sitting the following subjects achieved a grade 7 to 9 – Biology, Chemistry, Chinese, Computer Science and Physics.
- Many vocational subjects also performed fantastically well with Performing Arts, Childcare, Engineering and ICT Digital Information Technology all demonstrating outstanding results once again.

We are proud then to celebrate the achievements of our Year 11 students as they receive their GCSE results today, marking the culmination of five years of dedication, growth, and resilience.

We extended our heartfelt congratulations to all students, recognising not just their academic results, but also their personal development throughout their time at Priory.
