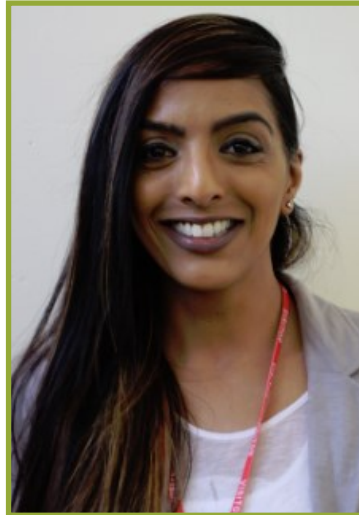


Our Current School Governors
