Explore Preston

You could explore Preston city centre's culture and heritage through a **city centre tour**, whether with a tour guide or self-guided. The **Preston City Centre Statue Trail** is a fantastic opportunity to discover Preston's statues at your own pace, whilst admiring their details and varying styles and learning about their history.

Also in the city centre, you will find the **Preston Cenotaph** - a Grade I listed war memorial. The remarkable structure sits on the **Flag Market**, where you can expect performances, markets and many cultural events taking place throughout the year.



For rainy days, retire to one of Preston's Halls or Towers. Choose between the stunning medieval settings at **Samlesbury Hall**, and the charming **Hoghton Tower**. These beautiful period buildings are a haven for heritage and architecture lovers.

Alternatively, see what's on at the **Preston Playhouse**.



Preston City Centre Statue Trail

Trail length: 1.5 miles approx. Taking around 40 minutes.

Start: Preston Martyrs Memorial Statue, Lune Street

This trail focuses on statues and sculptures within the city centre, all within walking distance from each other. Ending in Avenham and Miller Parks, be sure to also admire the parks' stunning architecture and beautiful fountains dating back to the 1800s.

The Preston City Centre Statue Trail is a casual walk which involves city centre and park footpaths. The route is wheelchair and pushchair friendly, however, it does include some gradual downhill and uphill paths.
