

DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD SCHEME – GENERAL UPDATE AND EXPEDITION INFORMATION

All pupils should now have nearly completed their two 3 month sections and be well on the way to completing their 6 month section. I have asked that all pupils submit three pieces of evidence for each section. Please can you ensure that this is completed by Wednesday, 1 May 2024.

All pupils have worked really hard to get to this stage and I do hope they have found their Duke of Edinburgh experience rewarding. We are now at the stage where we need to think about our final section; the expedition. In order for pupils to be awarded with the complete Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award they need to successfully complete a two day, one night expedition.

Year 10 Bronze Expedition:

The expedition will take place in and around the Rivington area, with pupils camping at Bibby's Farm. Pupils are required to complete six hours of activity each day (dates and activities below). In order for pupils to participate in the expedition an additional £50 is required to be paid via SCOPay before Wednesday, 1 May 2024. If pupils do not attend the expedition or fail to meet the expedition assessment requirements, they will only receive the Duke of Edinburgh participation award for completing of their sections.

Friday, 21 June 2024 (Period 1-3): Bag packing and preparation. Pupils will need to bring all of their kit (see kit list in the information pack), excluding perishable goods, to school with them in the morning. This session will ensure that bags are correctly packed, pupils have all the correct equipment and weight is distributed amongst their group. Bags will be stored in HU2 ready to collect on the morning of the expedition.


Monday, 24 June 2024: Pupils need to be in school for 8.40am ready for a prompt start at 9am.

- 4.5 hours walking.
- Arrive at Bibby's Farm (camp set up)
- 1.5 hours kayaking and open canoe (run by an instructor)
- Smores and campfire.

Tuesday, 25 June 2024: Arrive back at school approx. 5pm.

• 6 hours walking

In accordance with DofE requirements, pupil walking teams will be supervised remotely rather than directly. This means that supervising staff will be in the vicinity, will meet pupils at pre-arranged checkpoints

and will be able to step in to help pupils if required. However, pupil walking teams will have primary responsibility for their own navigation and team decisions. Staff will be directly supervising pupils cooking with the camping stoves.

In order to ensure that all pupils are prepared and have the adequate skills to pass the Award, a practise walk will take place on Monday, 20 May during Periods 1-4. Pupils will go out in groups for a 40 minute to one hour walk around Penwortham.

Preparation For The Expedition

In order for pupils to pass the expedition assessment, pupils will be required to attend several after school sessions. These sessions are mandatory as they will acquire the skills and preparatory knowledge needed for the expedition. All pupils have to complete their expedition in teams of four to seven participants and complete the expedition self-sufficiently as a group (this is a requirement set by Duke of Edinburgh, not the school). Sessions for Year 10 pupils will run on a Thursday night after school from 3:10pm-4:10pm starting on Thursday, 29 February 2024.

- 21 March Compass skills and route planning
- 18 April Route planning
- 3 May Route planning and using a trangia
- 16 May First aid and emergency procedures

- 6 June Kits and tents
- 13 June Expedition preparation and recap
- 21 June Bag packing and preparation *(Friday)*
