Year 9 & 10 in Maths Challenge

This Thursday, 40 selected pupils from Year 9 and 10 sat down and tested their skills in the UK Mathematics Trust Intermediate Challenge.

The challenge involves answering 25 various multiple choice maths questions, under strict exam conditions, in a one hour period, meaning each pupil got just over two minutes to figure out and answer each question.

Results are then calculated and those who find themselves in the top 40% of entries will receive a gold, silver or bronze award in the ratio of 1:2:3 and the best in school receives their own award.

In last year's competition, student Harshal Gosai was so successful in this competition that he was recognised nationally and invited to attend maths masterclasses at Liverpool University, as well as receiving coverage in the Lancashire Evening Post.
