## The Priory Facelift Begins!

**Pupils, Parents and Staff may have noticed an increase in workmen around the Priory site this week, because the Priory facelift has officially begun!**

Mr Bolton, the Priory Site Manager, welcomed contractors to the site on Monday and since then they have set up scaffolding and set up their own campus near the B/Rosla Block. Building work has started immediately on top of the Senior Management Corridor, Staff Room and Office area.

We announced that we had been chosen to receive funding to help renovate the school in the 2015 Spring newsletter and now it is becoming a reality to bring the front of the school in line with the fantastic facilities we already have around site.

The planned improvements will see the front of the school get a much-needed facelift, including many new windows and improvements, which

will then dramatically alter the entering view of Priory, reception area and front of school in general.

On the improvements, Mr Eastham said:

"To have yet more significant investment in the school to improve the look and feel of the roofs, windows and ultimately, the entire school learning environment, for our pupils, is another example of how the school is moving forward to support our pupils in the best possible ways."

"We want Priory to continue to be a school that pupils feel proud to come to and the way the school looks helps hugely in creating that feeling for them. Whilst the work on the roofs will go largely unseen, replacement of old windows with new and the significant improvements that will be made to the gym in particular will undoubtedly enhance the learning experience for our pupils."
