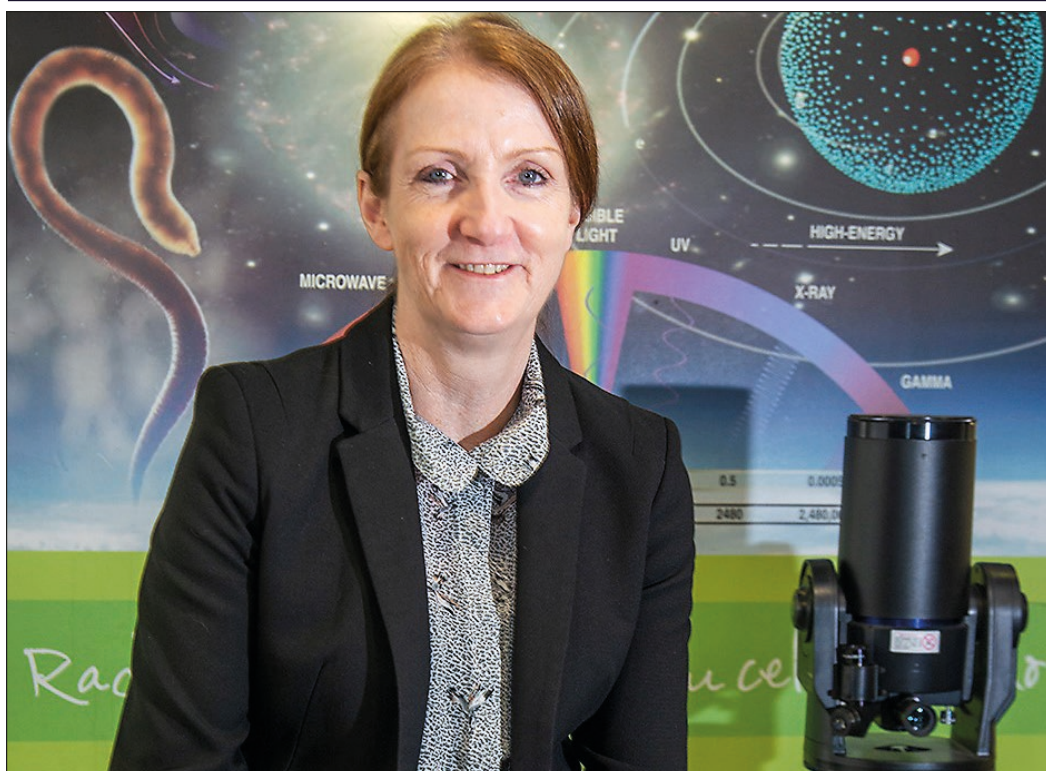

Ms Young 'Waves' Goodbye to Priory

Priory will say goodbye to Assistant Head Teacher & Head of Science, Ms Young, after nearly 20 years in the science department.

Ms Young came to Priory in 2001 after firstly being at Highfield in Blackpool and then Head of Science at Tulketh. The Headteacher at the time, Mr Young, gave Ms Young the role of Head of Science and she says she has loved every minute of it.

"It's been fantastic. It's strange to think that my first tutor group in 1987 will now be in their 50s! I think the best thing has been seeing the careers former students have gone onto, seeing the lives they have had. I bump into many, I saw a student who has become a successful plumber the other day, and it's great to catch up. It's also been rewarding seeing trainee teachers' progress, one ended up as my son's Head of Year.

"The ethos of Priory has remained the same in those 20 years, it's always been a caring school and there has always been the drive to be more academic.

"Teaching has changed massively though. We were in the old science labs, which dated back to the 1950s, when I started and I was standing in front of a class. Now we have the Nucleus, we have whiteboards and it's a lot more about participating and being active in class, which is what is needed for 21st century students."

Ms Young says one of the highlights was overseeing student Jamie Edwards as he became the youngest person in the world age 13 to create nuclear fusion in school.

"Writing the risk assessment for that was interesting! We had to go to Manchester for high voltage training and that was an eye-opener. That was a memorable part of being here.

Site Maintenance Over The Summer

Priory will look different in September after a successful bid to improve the fencing around the school.

The school has been granted £177,000 from the Education & Skills Funding Agency to have more secure fencing put up around the perimeter of the site.

"We are pleased to have been granted a significant amount of money which is part of our plans for safeguarding," said Headteacher, Mr Eastham.

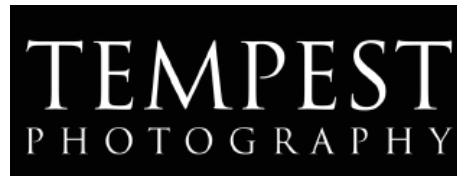
"The safety of pupils is paramount and this is another step into ensuring Priory is a secure and safe site. From September, there will be automated gates so cars and buses just can't come onto the site and communication about this will be sent out before September about the new ways of accessing the school."

Priory has also been granted £79,000 for their domestic hot and cold water pipes.

"It means we can remove water tanks we don't use, clear ducts under the ground and the general water system will be updated making it healthier and more economic," said Business Manager, Mrs Barker.

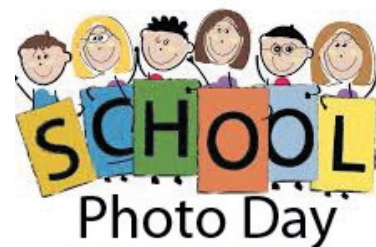
School Photography

"I also remember taking ten Year 7 students to America which was awesome as we went behind the scenes at NASA and the Kennedy Space Centre as well as Seaworld. I have been to Westminster Abbey to Professor Hawking's interment, been to CERN and had some great experiences."

Ms Young will be 57 when she retires and she may come into school in other roles as she is not leaving STEM behind.

She started the Astronomy GCSE as Priory, taking it herself, and said: "I will continue to be a member of PADAS (Preston and District Astronomy Society) and I was voted onto the Institute of Physics Women in Physics Committee so I will be continuing to promote physics to girls."

For her leaving present, Ms Young will be getting a solar telescope.

"I am really excited about that. I will also run more and relax!"

Headteacher Mr Eastham said: "Ms Young has been a valued and instrumental member of my Senior Leadership Team ever since I became Headteacher five years ago. Before that, both myself and Ms Young were Head of Departments, me in Sport and Ms Young in Science, and so I worked closely with her."

"Ms Young, throughout her 20 years here, has always put Priory first. She will be missed and we wish her all the best in her retirement. We may see her back in school in her other roles."

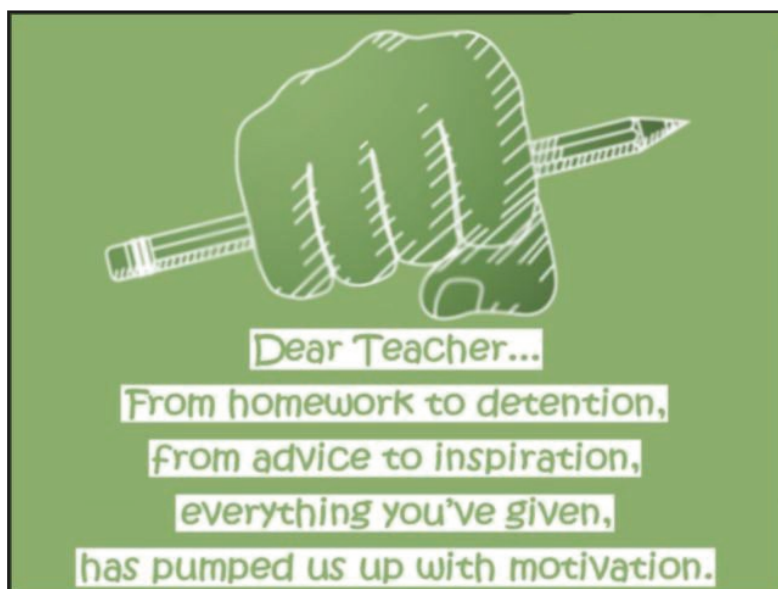

Year 10 student Colin was praised as 'outstanding' by Ms Young after winning the UCLan Ogden Trust Award for Physics for Priory.

The Ogden Trust aims to increase the uptake of physics for all at post-16, particularly for those from under-represented groups.

Assistant Headteacher Ms Young nominated Colin and said: "Colin is an outstanding Physics student.

"He has already taken his GCSE in Astronomy and will assist with tutoring other students in Astronomy as one of our Science Ambassadors next school year.

"Being a member of the Ogden Trust means Colin may have access to grants and internships which can help him in the future."

Twenty-seven pupils have been nominated by their schools as they have demonstrated a scientific curiosity which has enhanced their enthusiasm and resulted in high levels of achievement – often sharing this passion with their fellow pupils. Colin was presented with the award at UCLan and, while he admits he enjoys Physics, he does lean towards other sciences.

"Biology is my strongest subject and I think I want to be a researcher in Biology in the future. I was surprised but honoured to win the Ogden Trust Award from UCLan. I was given gift vouchers which I have already spent on books!"

A synonym is a word that has a very similar or the same meaning as another word.

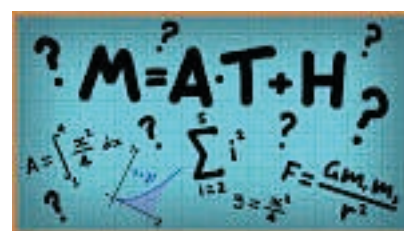
So synonyms for 'tired' include 'depleted' and 'weary'
