# Priory pupils are showing charity and kindness as part of **PLEdge** the PiXL Edge award.

PiXL Edge is a national award recognised

by colleges and employers which emphasises the development of what are known as LORIC attributes: Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative and Communication.

The majority of Priory pupils are participating in the Apprentice Level which requires pupils to provide two pieces of evidence for each LORIC Attribute.

The Priory culture focus this term is 'Kindness' incorporating charity, which provides opportunities to develop LORIC attributes.

Year 10 pupil, Sasha is an ambassador for Kindness and she is showing her LORIC skills by organising a reverse advent foodbank, Cards for Kindness for old people's care homes and more. "I need to show leadership, organisation and communication skills by advertising my events, helping the Year 7s to get involved and encourage people to be nice to each other and think about kindness," said Sasha.

Olivia is an ambassador for Charity. She has already organised a MacMillan Coffee Morning in school and recently sold poppies for the Royal British Legion. Olivia will now be organising events such as Christmas jumper day leading up to the festive period.

Year 10 Olivia's design (opposite) was intricately painted and chosen for her attention to detail which also incorporated the school's branding.


Runner up was Year 7 Jack W's design which was a combination of digital and hand created artwork.

#### Are you entitled?

# **Free School Meals**

Whether your child is starting school for the first time or if you already have children on roll at school, you may not be aware whether you are entitled to claim Free School Meals.

By registering your child for Free School Meals means the school receives additional funds (called Pupil Premium) which can assist with purchasing additional resources to aid achievement.

To qualify for Free School Meals you

must be in receipt of certain benefits (see website below for full list) and live in Lancashire. Registering your child is confidential and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.

Parents must apply through the Lancashire County Council's Area Education Office. They can immediately check your entitlement via the DfE Electronic Free School Meals Checking Service if you provide them with your name, date of birth and NI number. Alternatively you can download an application form from our website or apply on line.



Once Free School Meals entitlement has been granted, your eligibility will be reviewed on a regular basis. You therefore do not need to re-apply each year. The school will be notified directly by the council that your child/ children can have a school meal free of charge.

# Word **Re**Week




