Meet the Lead Teacher for History - Mr Eccles

Mr Eccles is the new Lead Teacher for History at Priory and is making a big impact already.

Mr Eccles came to Priory in September from Our Lady & St John Catholic College in Blackburn, where he taught for over 10 years. He studied Modern American History at the University of Sheffield and is keen to make a difference at Priory.

"I came to a meeting here quite a few years ago but I was impressed with it," said Mr Eccles. "When I saw the job advertised, I wanted a new challenge and this is perfect for me.

"My aim is to raise the profile of history at Priory, to get more students taking it at GCSE level and to encourage more workshops and real-life experiences of history."

He has already used his contacts as Steve Irwin from Blackburn Museum came in, with artefacts and costumes, to talk about the English Civil War to Year Eights recently.

Head of Humanities Mr Metcalfe said: "I am thrilled with how Mr Eccles has settled in at Priory. Together with myself, Mr Eccles has redesigned the five-year curriculum structure of history for the benefit of all our students.

"New topics have been introduced and a new style of lesson that incorporates fertile questions has been very popular with our students across both key stages. These lessons aim to engage and provoke inquisition so that learning is fun and exciting.

"Coupled with this, Mr Eccles has integrated new trips and visits to supplement the learning in the classroom. The English Civil War Exhibition run by Steve Irwin from Blackburn Museum before half term has been a great example of this, and the two day visit was an integral cog in showing students first-hand what they have been learning in the classroom.

"Mr Eccles is truly bringing history from the past into the future here at Priory."


Ms Kennedy will be visiting Priory on 7 December.


In 2016, the school won the North West in Bloom Environmental Award for Schools – the first time a school in Lancashire had won it.

Mr Farron, who began working as a volunteer after he retired and now works around 20 hours a week, has transformed Priory over his four years working here, turning unused areas into a herbaceous garden, a Mediterranean garden, a memorial garden and more.

"I am thrilled for the school and for the community," said Mr Farron. "The gardens are for the students and for those who also use Priory in the evenings and weekends; it's great to be recognised.

"It's a proud achievement for everyone connected with Priory and it fits in with our headteacher, Mr Eastham's vision for Priory to be locally respected and nationally recognised."





PiXL Edge - Priory's Awards Scheme

Launched to the pupils this week, PiXL Edge seeks to nurture self-assured and confident young people whilst supporting a well-rounded education.

PiXL Edge gives pupils the opportunity to develop key life attributes through targeted activities and challenges especially chosen for their formative qualities in character development as well as their desirability by employers. PiXL can help pupils to discover their own strengths and aptitudes, and inspire and expand themselves as individuals.

Mrs Hopes, Head of Character & Culture, leads the programme which has been rolled out to all pupils. Pupils who want to participate must complete the blue 'Activity Research and Selection' sheet from Mrs Hopes or the school office and complete it with activity ideas they have discussed during preps and lessons. Completed forms should be returned to the school office by 9 November.

On launching the scheme for 2018-19, Mrs Hopes said:

"This is a fantastic opportunity for Priory pupils to be recognised for utilising personal attributes in and out of school. Our pupils participate in so many activities outside of lessons and appear to be keen to gain recognition for their efforts. There has been a great deal of interest in the award so far and I look forward to reading about the vast array of activities our pupils will be engaged in."

After listening to presentations and reading various promotions in school, pupils can select ten activities across five attributes to work towards their award.

LEADERSHIP Making decisions, leadership skills, accepting responsibility

ORGANISATION Time management

Showing commitment, flexibility, ability to work under pressure

INITIATIVE Creativity and problem solving skills, being a team player

COMMUNICATION Communication

Pupil participation this year is encouraged as follows:

Year 7 – All pupils to complete the award this year.

Years 8-10 - All pupils to complete at least two activities this year.

Year 11 – To complete what they have started either this year or the previous year, however there is no pressure to complete the award due to their focus on GCSE study.

The five attributes are:

- Leadership (eg. Making decisions, acting responsibly, collaborating)
- Organisation (eg. Time management, problem solving)
- Resilience (eg. Showing commitment, working under pressure,)
- Initiative (eg. Creativity and seeing the value in being of service to others)
- Communication (eg. Editing, presenting, matching form and content to the audience)

Pupils will be able to view resources, information and share their activity evidence through a dedicated area on SharePoint. Progress can be made through three levels (Apprentice, Graduate, Master) as they move up the school. Each level should take no longer than a term to complete and can be achieved either alone or as part of a small group in class, extra-curricular or in their lives outside school.

Pupils will receive a Priory PiXL Edge Attribute certificate at completion of each attribute activity. On completion of all ten activities pupils will receive their PiXL Edge Apprentice Award and an interactive digibadge, which records details of the scheme and their achievements online.

More than 700 schools are now members of the scheme which is backed by employers. The awards can be used to support applications to college, university and employment, giving them a competitive recruitment edge.

Careers Advice

Mr Ficorilli, Priory's independent careers guidance adviser is available in school every Monday to offer independent careers advice and guidance as well as arrange individual career appointments with any Years 9-11 pupils.



Pupils may wish to discuss the various post 16 career pathways on offer at colleges, with employers through apprenticeship or training programmes, life at university and degree courses or signposting for potential work experience.

Mr Ficorilli will also be available at Year 11 parents evening on Wednesday, 28 November to meet, discuss and answer any questions relating to post 16 options with parents.

Pupils will have the opportunity to meet employers, professionals, colleges, training organisations, third sector voluntary groups and local universities.

The aim of the event is to raise awareness of the post-16 options and the different jobs and careers available. It is for the whole school and a programme of the day will be sent out.

Mr Ficorilli will be holding assemblies with the year groups to brief them on the purpose of the day. All pupils will be provided with a list of age-appropriate questions that they can use to ask about life at college or working with an employer of the future.

Basketball


Year 7 basketball training will start on Monday 3.30pm to 4.15pm.



The parents of Daniel Appleby, who sadly passed away last year, have dedicated an award to Priory in his memory. Each year, the Friendship award will be presented to the pupil who has shown to be the best ambassador for friendship, kindness and support either in school, during extra curricular activities or on a trip. They will also

Daniel died last year following a brain haemorrhage linked with diabetes, which he had since he was 11 years old. His family held an It's a Knockout Roadshow at school in the summer with all money raised going towards Preston and Chorley Junior Diabetic Support Group.
