Priory takes back sports facilities operations from South Ribble Borough Council

South Ribble Borough Council and Penwortham Priory Academy are pleased to announce some changes to the operation of the sports facilities at Penwortham Leisure Centre from April 2021 following the end of the current dual use leisure service contract.

Penwortham Priory Academy will take back the facilities within the school to operate them in-house. This means the school will take back ownership and management of the 3G football pitch, sports hall and multi-use games area from 1 April 2021 and allow community access to these facilities.

The swimming pool, fitness suite, dance studio and squash courts will remain under the ownership of South Ribble Borough Council and will continue to be managed by the Authority, or its partner, moving forward.

Councillor Mick Titherington Cabinet member for Health, Wellbeing and Leisure said: "We have been in discussions with the school and we continue to share the vision to make leisure facilities available to our community. We have built up a very good working relationship with the school and have every confidence that Penwortham Priory Academy will continue to provide outstanding facilities and opportunities to the people of Penwortham. Priory, along with other schools and partners, will ensure the people of South Ribble are able to make healthy lifestyle choices."

Both the school and the council will create a board to hold twice yearly meetings to integrate community access to the school sports facilities in line with South Ribble's Leisure and Sport Facility Strategy.

become a collaborative partner with South Ribble, contributing to the delivery of their long term Leisure and Sport Facilities Strategy by continuing to provide and enhance our school facilities for the people of Penwortham. 

How's The Home Learning Going?

Penwortham Priory Academy Deputy Headteacher Mrs Cowell has said the positive feedback from parents has shown the school's lockdown strategy is a success.

The majority of Priory pupils are working from home while a small percentage, children of key workers and vulnerable pupils, are in school.

The pupils that are in school are receiving the same lessons as the pupils at home.

"We used Microsoft Teams in the first lockdown to deliver live lessons to pupils, we had to evolve and adapt

quickly and it worked well," said Mrs Cowell.



"We prepared for another lockdown before Christmas, sending teachers home with laptops and microphone headsets and so we had everything in place despite the arrangements changing quickly.

"We communicated with parents to make sure they were prepared too and so the plan was in place.

"It was our first full day on Wed, 5 January of delivering lessons on Microsoft Teams and we had between 97-100 per cent attendance which is really high.

"The children in school are accessing the same lessons at the same time so everyone is getting exactly the same education whether in school or out of school.

"For those pupils who don't have laptops or wifi at home, teachers in every subject have prepared a paper pack which parents pick up once a week but we are hopeful that all children will be on-line in the near future.

"The feedback has been positive so far. Parents have contacted us saying what we have put in place is working well. It's the closest thing to children being in school, but at home, which is what we want to hear.

"We have had to be innovative. It's all positive despite the challenging situation."



Rapid COVID-19 Testing in School

As per all secondary schools across English, we have now received the lateral flow device test kits. Last week, staff on site were invited to have their regular weekly tests followed this week by children of critical workers and vulnerable pupils who are in school.

Rapid testing helps identify those asymptomatic cases that might otherwise not be detected, causing the virus

to spread further.

Whilst testing is being offered in school, Priory's dining room has been repurposed as the testing centre and Science technician, Mr Evans will be overseeing the procedures. Pupils in school during lockdown will be taken in pairs to the dining room and the test will be conducted by trained Priory staff, both of whom are former nurses. As soon as the test (which takes around 40 seconds) is completed, pupils will go back to class and continue with their school day.

Headteacher, Mr Eastham said: "All schools have been offered the opportunity to test staff and pupils from January, which we fully want to support and engage with to keep all those in our community as

safe as possible. Along with the other protective measures we have in place in school, these tests will help staff and pupils attend school safely. Up to one third of people who have coronavirus experience no symptoms, so by taking part in the testing, we will help to stop the virus spread".

Positive test results will be known within 30 minutes of taking the test. Anyone testing positive will be notified immediately and parents asked to collect their child from school. We will not inform pupils if they test negative.






It may seem like some time ago now however, before the Christmas break, the school recognised pupils who had achieved 97% attendance from September to the last day of the Autumn term.

Thank you as ever for the many positive comments and constructive feedback we received from the recent parent survey. All that we continue to do as a school is a result of the whole Priory team and we appreciate the generosity of your feedback, particularly the overwhelming positive comments we have

received in relation to our live lessons.

Please find below, answers to many of the questions you posed for us and we are grateful to you for highlighting some of these concerns. As always, if you still have questions then do contact us at enquiries@priory.lancs.sch.uk.

My child has live lessons, but how do I know what lessons he/she has on what day? Where can I find the timetable?

All students are following their normal timetable as if they were in school, with the exception of their Learning for Life lesson. This is to allow some screen down time during the day. You can find the timetable of your son/daughter using your Synergy portal here www.priory. lancs.sch.uk/parents/synergy

The live lessons are great, but they only last 25 minutes and the normal lesson timetable is 60 minutes. Why is this?

Whilst we have adopted a Live Learning @ Priory approach, this does not necessarily mean that live lessons will last a full 60 minutes. The live teaching may be organised into smaller chunks and may be spread across the hour — therefore giving students time away from screen to complete the tasks that have been discussed by the teacher.

My child is working for the full 5 hours per day. This is a lot of screen time. How will Priory help to support and alleviate this?

In the first instance, we have tried to reduce screen time by ensuring that most lessons last approximately 25 minutes. If lessons need to last longer then induvial teachers will inform students in advance. Further to this, we have removed the need to attend Learning for Life in the interim period in order to encourage more time away from any device screen. Finally, we're temporarily suspending lessons on Wednesday, 27 January to focus on well-being. We're all living in different and challenging circumstances from what we're used to so it's important that we take a break for our well-being and mental health. On this day, all pupils are invited to opt into a variety of activities in a change from their normal studies.

As PE lessons have been suspended along with being in school as a whole, how will Priory support the physical activity of my child?

In PE lesson time we want pupils to be active!! What this involves is up to the individual pupil. It may be that they want to go for a walk, a run or a bike ride during the lesson. If the weather is rainy, we have provided a number of links in the files tab of their PE class Team. These include links for over 80 activities from cardio workouts and boxing sessions to Pilates and yoga. These can all be done from the comfort of home. There are two requests from staff, firstly please ensure the activity is finished in time to start the next lesson and secondly pupils mustn't forget to let their PE teacher know what they've been doing. So far we've heard how pupils are getting on with their 'Couch to 5k' Challenge, received screenshots from Strava of their runs and even videos of 'Just Dance'!!

Will teachers be able to accommodate more group work within their lessons?

Yes. All our staff are dedicated to the Digital Transformation Programme that is running at Priory. Through the use of Microsoft Teams our staff are already experimenting and teaching each other on the use of 'breakout rooms' in Teams where students can continue to interact and have discussions about the learning in the lesson.

What if my child misses a lesson? How can this be caught up?

The use of Microsoft Teams allows all staff to record their live lessons or pre-record any lesson. Many of the live lessons are recorded and can therefore be watched back by students in their own time when convenient. Lessons have been uploaded into the shared FILES

section within each class channel and so students should be able to access their dated lesson here.

Not all teachers and students are using cameras. This is making the learning difficult. What is the school's policy on this?

Whilst we have asked that pupils start their lessons with cameras on to aid registration, turning a camera on is optional. Some pupils may not have cameras on the devices they are using. If they are able to turn a camera on and are comfortable to do so, it can make teaching easier. We have given guidance about appropriate backgrounds. Staff too will have their cameras on whenever possible, but this may not always be the case for an entire lesson.

I'm worried by child is missing out on the pastoral element of school – for example seeing their friends and well-being checks by staff.

Even though learning is taking place at home, it is important to be reassured that year group assemblies and welfare checks with pupils are still taking place. Year group assemblies sustain the link between year group peers and their Head of Year. Teachers in lessons regularly check on the welfare of their students in their live lessons.

My child has been removed from some lessons by other students and this has stopped learning. What are you doing about this?

Our IT team and teachers have worked exceptionally hard to enable live lessons to be taught so students continue to be taught the sequenced curriculum. They continue to work hard and communicate with teachers to find solutions to some of the minor issues we have experienced. We are pleased to inform you that this has now been disabled by the IT team so further issues should not arise. Teachers will also follow the normal school behaviour policy and sanction students appropriately in these circumstances.

My child hands their work in to different teachers in different ways. This is becoming confusing. Can this be standardised?

Here at Priory, we have a dedicated team of Microsoft Teams experts who are working hard to review and standardise this process. The use of any remote platform is new for many staff and pupils alike, but we continue striving to evolve our current practices to ensure the most efficient and effective submission of work. This is something the school is currently addressing and will communicate shortly to parents and pupils.




The PE department is providing pupils with many suggestions for activities and fitness sessions to complete in their allocated PE lessons.
