

Class of 2020 GCSE Certificate Collection

Class of 2020 pupils can now collect their GCSE certificates from the school office from Mon, 30 November.

Certificates will be available to collect during school hours by either the former pupil or their parent and must be signed for.* Visitors must wear a face covering.



We would like to take this opportunity to emphasise how important it is that the exam certificates are collected, as they are very important documents that are likely to be needed throughout the future and particularly if a path to university is planned.

School is only legally obliged to keep certificates for a 12 month period, after which time they are disposed of. If copies of certificates are needed after that time, students will need to contact the appropriate examination board(s) directly and pay costs to obtain copies. As you will appreciate, these costs can mount up.

We have also filmed a Celebration Awards presentation where we share the successes and achievements of last year's leavers and give our thanks. The film is currently in editing and we will inform families of the video link for this once it is available. Any trophies, certificates and other prizes awarded will be available for pupils to collect along with their GCSE certificates.

The winner will receive a voucher for a store of their choice and there will be two runners up who will receive fantastic prizes!.


This is a completely voluntary competition, and your castle can be made

Actor Michael Southern, who has played Mickey in the West End for more than 10 years, will do live reconstructions of the key scenes over Zoom for Priory's Year 11 GCSE pupils as well as a question and answer session.

"Most academic years we go to watch a production at the Preston Charter Theatre or we have been as far as Stoke and last year we were meant to go to Birmingham but lockdown stopped it," said Mrs Gidden.

"I knew this year we needed to do something different so we got in touch with Michael.

"He will act out live reconstructions of some of the key scenes and answer any questions from our pupils about the play in a session before Christmas.

"Willy Russell is the patron of Michael's company so Michael knows him and knows the correct interpretation of the play.

"It's a struggle to have empathy with some characters such as Linda but the pupils will get the chance to find out why they should have sympathy with them, from the person who created them.


"It's tailor-made for GCSE pupils and it's a much improved version of just watching a production on YouTube. They will get the chance to dig into the mind of an actor."







- Toiletries or toiletry gift sets they can give out as presents, baby wipes, lip balms
- Non-perishable food (anything in a tin or packet), along with bake at home bread, longlife milk
