It's 'GOOD' to Finally Celebrate!

At last, we can celebrate our 'Good' all-round grading from our Ofsted inspection in March.



The week after the inspection, we went into lockdown. Covid-19 meant that everyone at Priory couldn't properly celebrate the grading that staff, pupils and the governors worked so hard for.

Now Headteacher Mr Eastham feels we can finally give ourselves a pat on the back – although he does say there is more to come!

"We didn't get the opportunity to celebrate our Ofsted grading as Covid suddenly took up all our attention and school shut down. Now though we can reflect on what was a significant and great outcome for the school and we can now celebrate with pupils and staff."

The quality of education, behaviour of attitudes, personal development and leadership and management were all marked as good, meaning the school has an overall Ofsted grading of 'Good.'

Mr Eastham continued: "What we are especially proud of is that we are at the top end of 'Good.' That's really encouraging for us but we are not going to stop there, we won't get complacent, we will push on to be even better."

Of the report Mr Eastham said: "I am proud to be the headteacher of a firmly good school in all areas of the inspection framework. I am very pleased that inspectors recognised that our pupils are typically happy and feel safe at school. They saw

pupils behaving sensibly in lessons and around the school, they said pupils are polite and considerate towards others and that pupils get on well with each other and their teachers

"I am equally pleased that inspectors recognised our pupil's 'wider personal development', their Character development, as being very important to us as a school too, as well as their academic progress.

"We all remain firmly committed, as always, to providing a quality education for every one of our pupils, and whilst remaining caring, we will continue to be progressive

with high academic standards, to ensure we continue being a firmly good school where individual pupils learn to succeed.

"Of course, we will not be complacent following this positive inspection, with Priory continuing to be 'a rapidly improving school' as we move forward from here."

In their report the Ofsted inspectors stated: "Penwortham Priory Academy is a rapidly improving school. Pupils are typically happy and feel safe. We saw pupils behaving sensibly in lessons and around the school.

"Pupils are now learning more than in the past. This is because of the widespread improvements that have been made to the quality of education. Leaders have made sure that the curriculum is ambitious for all pupils, including those with SEND and those who are disadvantaged. This is helping to transform the learning of these pupils.

"Leaders think that pupils' wider personal development is very important. They have planned opportunities carefully to help pupils become healthy, responsible and moral citizens.

Leaders have skilfully overseen the improvements made. The staff are extremely motivated and keen to improve the school further."

We had a special visitor today...


It was too late to publish a full article before this newsletter went to press, however Drama Teacher Miss Howell would be disappointed not see something of today's excitement in print today.

The family of Daniel Appleby have brought in this year's plaque which will be presented to a pupil for friendship and kindness.

It's been awarded every year since Daniel died in 2017, following a brain haemorrhage linked with diabetes, which he had since he was 11 years old. He attended Priory from 1997-2002.

His dad Mick, mum Julie along with brother Richard, who also attended Priory, came into school. There is also sister Lucy who attended Priory.

Julie said: "We want Daniel to be remembered in places that were close to him and Priory was one.

"He loved school, his illness meant he couldn't always be there but he got a lot from his friends staying in touch with him while he was at home.

"He was inspirational every day, he worked so hard and, while he didn't leave with fantastic

qualifications, he left with a work ethic which helped him become an apprentice electrician.



"We present this award every year and it's not for academic success, it's for a pupil who has not let anything hold them back, like Daniel didn't.

"It's for someone who is an inspiration, who gets on with things no matter what they are experiencing in their lives."

Geography teacher, Mr Watters, who taught Daniel, will help to select the pupil who will win this year's award.

He said: "Dan Appleby was one of our most friendly, positive pupils, the life and soul of his year group. He was most popular with peers and staff alike as he was always there to ask if anyone needed help."

"Dan came away to Belgium on one of the many combined Football and WW1 History tours. He was voted 'tourist of the tour' by the whole group, typical of how we all felt about Dan.

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
"The Appleby family have remained great friends of Priory. When we were messaged about his passing there were many tears in the staff room. Dan's family have held a number of events to help raise money in his memory. Priory has hosted a very successful family sports challenge day where many of his school pals joined to run and fall over the many varied obstacles.

"The new plaque will be awarded annually to recognise the leaving Year 11 who has promoted the same warmth of positive friendship that Dan did throughout his years at Priory. Dan will always be part of our Priory family. We thank the family for their continued kindness to Priory.

"On a personal note, if we all strive to add one act of kindness every day, we will all keep the memory of Dan Appleby alive every day."




