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Parking - A polite request

We have received several complaints this week from neighbours and parents regarding parking around the school during drop-off and collection times. Therefore, we would like raise the importance of parking safely and considerately, and to not block drives.

We appreciate that the first few days of the new academic year are always busier with more cars than normal. We have lots of Year 7 parents dropping off and collecting pupils on their first week and we will see an increase in car usage as many pupils will not access the buses at this moment in time.

Last year we took the decision to finish ten minutes earlier to reduce the congestion and up until yesterday it had worked fantastically. We hope as time passes there will be a significant reduction again in cars outside school and this will hopefully ease the situation.

Face Masks

The advice for secondary school pupils in England, published by the government, is that "schools will have the discretion to require face coverings in communal areas if they believe that is right in their particular circumstances."

However, in areas where transmission of the virus is high - and where government interventions such as local



lockdowns are in place - face coverings will be mandatory for pupils in Year 7 and above in parts of schools where social distancing is not possible. This will not include in classrooms during lessons, where the government says they could "inhibit learning".

With this in mind therefore, all pupils must have with them in school a plain face mask that can be worn when directed to do so by staff.

When and where such face masks should be worn in school will be made clear to pupils in school during what can be a dynamic situation.

Please note, pupils travelling to school on any public transport, school bus or school minibus must wear an appropriate face covering.

Letters have been issued today to all pupils. The letter includes a unique code to enable parents to set up their child's catering pre-order account, a user guide and frequently asked questions.


The system will start from Monday, 7 September so orders for Monday will need to be placed prior to then. No food or drink will be available from


Year 10 & 11 English Literature



We are therefore recommending that pupils have their own copy of the text itself. This will also mean that pupils can highlight and annotate the book during the course of study, making it a valuable revision aid for them. Pupils will need the actual play-script not a text guide or revision guide.

"It's not all about results though, we hope they left Priory a fully engaged, caring and contributing member of our society. We are proud of each and every one of them."




Tanisha and Libby's stories made the press!

Year 11 pupil, Tanisha suffered a serious brain injury at the age of 10 but has overcome her memory problems to celebrate her GCSEs.

Tanisha was hit by a motorbike when she lived in Wigan and was on a life support machine for four days and then in Alder Hey Children's Hospital for months.

She suffered a brain injury and a compound fracture of the leg among other injuries but her mum said she was

extremely proud of the hard work Tanisha has put in to celebrate three Grade 5s, three Grade 4s and a pass at ICT.



"The support she has had from Mrs Holland, the SENCo at Priory, has been superb."

Tanisha said: "The support I have had has been brilliant. I have been helped with little tips such as using post-it notes and notepads to remember things.

"I am pleased with my results, I was shocked most at my science result as I got a 5 in Combined Science, I didn't expect that.

"I want to study Travel and Tourism at Runshaw College, I want to do something exciting and fun and not a boring job."

Synchronised swimmer Libby has learnt sign language during lockdown and also celebrated strong GCSE results.

Year 11 leaver, Libby, who has been part of the England Age Group training camps in synchronised swimming from the age of 13 and competed in the World Championships last year, secured a Grade 9 in history, three Grade 8s alongside Grades 7 and 6 in other subjects. Libby attained Grade 8 in PE which was Priory's highest.

"I thought I had failed my science so I was really pleased with a Grade 6/7 in Combined Science," said Libby. "I am happy with my results, especially PE."

As she hasn't been able to get in the pool during lockdown, although has been able to do land-based exercises, Libby decided to make use of her time wisely.

"There is a swimmer who is partially deaf and signs so I decided to learn it during lockdown. It is tricky remembering it but it's nice to be able to communicate with her."

Libby will go to Runshaw College to study Business, Law, History and PE and will also take an A-Level Sporting Diploma in Synchronised Swimming at Loughborough University, which she was asked to do. She is also taking an on-line coaching course in synchronised swimming.

"I love Science and Maths and want to study medicine in the future. It's hard to believe. It has been a difficult year with Covid-19 but it's turned out well."




Head Boy Colin celebrated eight Grade 9s and three Grade 8s - including an 8 in Astronomy.

Sian, Antonia, Nico and Jayden's Stories




Sian is following in her family footsteps in studying art.


