Drama teacher Miss Howell admits she can't wait to see the pupils back performing after Covid-19 restricted theatrical shows.

"The performance rights on Matilda have just been released so we decided to do this as it's something new and fresh," said Miss Howell.

"It is well-known, it's a favourite, everyone absolutely loves it and it is so much fun.

"We have such a diverse range of talent at Priory and, since our last production, other pupils have come forward to give it a go and it's not just about acting, it's about getting involved behind-the-scenes as well with props and design.

"We have been rehearsing three times a week and the pupils have shown a lot of dedication.

"The children love productions, it allows them to mix from Year 7 to Year 11s after 18 months of not mixing and it's like a little family."

Year 9

IntraHealth, the schools' immunisation team will be visiting Penwortham Priory Academy in the new year to vaccinate Year 9 pupils for **DTP (Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio) and Meningitis ACWY**.

Parents of Year 9 pupils have been issued with a link, via email, to access a secure portal where you can complete your child's details and submit consent or non-consent. Please follow the link (also included below), at your earliest convenience, to complete the green YES form to consent to the vaccination or the red NO form if you do not want your child to receive the vaccine. Further information about the immunisation programme can also be accessed via the link. Due to recent technical issues, the link will now remain live until 12 December.

Miss Nouraghaei's Science Classes Have Turned Green!



Priory's Year 8 and 10 pupils have become Supersized Climate Heroes and have been awarded a Blue Peter Climate Heroes green badge!

The green badge and certificates were awarded to pupils by Blue Peter, for showing they care about the environment and planet. They made their class pledges in the summer term last year and now finally they have received their coveted badges.

The project was led by Assistant Head of Science, Miss Nouraghaei.

"I decided to introduce this to my Year 7 classes last summer and then my Year 9s were equally as enthusiastic to get involved when I told them about it." said Miss Nouraghaei. "Many pupils had stories to share, showing how they are already working hard to look after our planet and fight climate change."



She said: "There were four pledges on Power, where pupils switch 30 minutes of screen time for 30 minutes of outdoor time; Plastic, sorting out the rubbish recycling at home carefully; Plants, save water by turning off the taps when you brush your teeth, and a Supersize pledge.

"Our Year 8s Supersize pledge was to eat more vegetarian food while our Year 10s was to switch off the lights and devices when leaving the classroom or building. We want them to see how, by making small changes, they can make a difference to the climate."

Pupils had to provide photographic evidence of them doing the pledges and promoting a greener environment. Pupils had to also encourage others to do their bit too. Then Miss Nouraghaei sent the evidence off to Blue Peter.

Year 8 Alex Y said: "We had to take pictures of ourselves recycling items. It certainly made me think more about the environment and how we need to care for it."

Tilly P said: "I recycled milk cartons, cans and crisp packages." Abbie S added: "I am proud to receive a green Blue Peter badge."

The pupils can now apply for their Blue Peter Badge Card to gain free access to over 200 attractions throughout the UK - see Miss Nouraghaei for your code.

We were saddened to be informed that Jack passed away suddenly on 23 October, aged 28 years.



Although Jack had muscular dystrophy, he lived his life to the full and he was an inspiration to everyone who knew him.

A celebration of Jack's life was held at West Lancs Crematorium, Burscough, last Friday 12 November. His former form tutor, Mrs Simpson, and Geography teacher Mr Watters, represented the school at his memorial service.

Mrs Simpson, in her heart-warming tribute, said, *"I feel privileged to have been Jack's form tutor through his time at Priory. Jack was an inspirational student who never let his condition define him. Jack was self-deprecating and when he arrived at a themed non-uniform day dressed as 'Andy' from Little Britain it raised more than a few smiles.*

"Jack also had a mischievous streak and a keen sense of humour. Priory had a lift installed so he could access all areas of school however, he had to have a support assistant with him when he used it. None of us liked the lift and would watch the ceiling coming towards us. Jack took great delight turning off the lift mid-floor and then waiting until we were suitably terrified before laughing and setting us off again!



"Jack also had his own rest-room, 'rest' being the operative word. It was actually party-central at Priory!

"It was an honour to represent Penwortham Priory Academy at the celebration of Jack's life and to share in the memories of a short life that was lived to the full. I will miss seeing Jack around Longton and having a chat and catch up but will remember fondly what an inspirational and exceptional young man he was."



Class of 2021 Celebration Evening & GCSE Certificate Collection






Bringing music to your ears at break and lunch

MABAL is music played through the school's tannoy system during break and lunch. Chosen by Mr Taylor, Lead Teacher for Music, this is designed to offer exposure to the curriculum in different ways, and support pupils' appreciation of music.

The focus is on one theme each week across a genre, a country or from history. The theme could also link to the season or an event in school, such as the upcoming production, Matilda.

Next week it's all about: Music from across the continents...

We'll be playing 'guess the country!' The Portuguese Fado one is not the easiest of listening. Most are the nationality of the singer, group or composer, though one is a little contrived, it is based upon the title of the track, rather than the singer's nationality.

This is a shorter playlist - normally we aim for four hours of material - so you will hear these two or three times in the week to give everyone a chance to guess the connection! Highlights, though this is all subjective, include the aching pathos of Mozart's Requiem, Beethoven's 7th symphony built around one bar of music and the brilliant Italian virtuoso violinist Paganini, via the Columbian "Queen of Latin Music" Shakira, Demis Roussos and Aqua.




