In the end, Layla was selected as the designer who fitted this year's 'Everybody's Reading' theme of the competition and of Priory.

Bookbuzz is back – and our Year 7 pupils have selected their own brand new book which they will receive after the half term break.

The pupils had 17 titles to choose from, from the Book Trust, and they included fast paced thrillers to non-fiction reads for curious minds.



English teacher Mrs Webster said:

"The Year 7s watched the authors talk about their books in Accelerated Reader classes and then they picked their favourites which will be gifted to them.

"One of the authors is Alesha Dixon and we were all surprised when she came up on the screen but it's great to see.

"It's so exciting when the children get a new book to hold, to smell and to keep. There is such a buzz when they all arrive."

Finley K has chosen the book 'Wonderscape' by Jennifer Bell. "It's about gaming and virtual reality and it looks a really exciting book," he said.

Eden B selected 'Slick' by MM Vaughan. "This is about gaming too. I like gaming so I want to see what it is all about."

Hiylie T opted for 'Across the Risen Sea' by Bren MacDibble. "It's about a girl finding her friend across the sea. I like adventure novels."

Maddie K-Mcl's selection was D-Day Dog by Tom Palmer. "Basically it's about an army dog. I love dogs, in fact I love all animals. At home we have five dogs, four horses, four cats, three chickens and a rabbit!"

Josh B also opted for 'Wonderscape.' "I chose this one because it's a much longer book and I like a challenge!"

Last year's Year 8s admitted they can still remember receiving their Bookbuzz books as Year 7s.

Jake L said: "I remember I chose 'Crater Lake', it's about a school trip to a massive crater which is infected by alien parasites. It was exciting to receive a new book, especially as it's free. It was amazing at the time."

Full STEM Ahead for Priory's Girls

Crime Scene Investigations came to Priory as the pupils from Year 9, 10 & 11 designed a photofit and admitted it was tricky even with it being someone they knew!

MCS Projects came into school for a Science and Technology Activity Day, specifically but not totally aimed at girls, to show them careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths).





There were two parts to it – one a robotics lesson and the other making a photofit on technology the police use.

Science teacher Mrs Massey said: "The aim of the day is to give pupils a wider view of STEM subjects. It's to encourage girls to get involved in STEM and show that it covers more than medicine, nursing and dentistry.

"There is also engineering, police, forensics and a lot more."

MCS Project partner John Waterworth said: "It's the first time we have been to Priory and it's great to come.

"Our sessions were based around raising enthusiasm for STEM and more insight into STEM and showing the different careers and the opportunities around STEM. It's also got to be fun so we make it as enjoyable as possible.

"We have done some sessions on Robotics where pupils learn how to programme a lego mindstream EV3 robot to navigate a course, with each robot equipped with infrared and proximity sensors.

"Then we have the session with the photofit. We get a teacher they know to come in and 'steal' a laptop and then they use the latest E-FIT 6 facial recognition software, which police use on identifying criminals, to create a computer image of the thief. They also consider problems associated with memory and facial recognition. Pupils love this one as it gives them a big buzz but it's a lot harder than they think!"







Maths is Everywhere!

On Monday, top set Year 10 pupils attended an online presentation on Applied Maths and Core Maths A-Level delivered by the Advanced Mathematics Support Programme, entitled 'Maths All Around Us'.

Maths is used in so many other subjects. Core Maths is a qualification which can sit alongside other A levels or BTECs - pupils watched the engaging session to find out how and why.

Maths teacher, Mr Scott said: The session was aimed at encouraging students to pursue studying Core Maths at A-level. Pupils saw how Maths is used in settings such as Psychology, Business (online marketing techniques and inflation) and Sports (F1 data visualisation). The students were engaged throughout, but were disappointed it wasn't longer!"

The next session delivered by the same programme will be about the Mathematics of Space - looking at some of the challenges faced in space travel and the ingenious solutions. The session will draw on pupils' knowledge of geometry, graphs and equations of motion.
