70th Anniversary - Keeping it in the Family

Priory proudly celebrates its 70th anniversary this year and we have been digging through our archives to look at how the school has changed since 1953.

There will be many celebrations and stories over the coming 12 months but firstly we had a chat with current pupils who have had members of their families attend Priory, either as Penwortham County Secondary Modern School or Priory Sports and Technology College before it became an Academy in 2012.

Pupils from Years 7-11 were amazed at the photographs, enjoyed seeing their families on some of the photos as well as spotting teachers who have spent most of their careers at Priory. It certainly means it's always been a family affair at Priory and the school has had a huge impact on its local community over the last 70 years.

Year 7 Connor said: "My mum was in Mrs Simpson's form who is still here now. She said Mrs Simpson was her favourite.

"Both my mum and dad came here – as well as Mrs Simpson, I think Mr Taylor and Mr Faulkner taught my mum and dad as well. It is a bit weird having the same teachers as your parents!"

Finn said: "I think my grandad came here, I am not sure, but my dad and uncle certainly did. My sister Macie is also here in Year 10."

Year 8 Evie spotted her dad on one of the school year books.



Katherine was happy to take part in a Q&A session with our pupils. Prior to the visit, the Humanities department and Debate Club pupils had put together a list of questions that pupils could pose to Katherine about her work as an MP.

Lead Teacher for Personal Development, Mrs Hopes, said, "The session was ideal experience for pupils who are interested in careers in leadership and forms of public representation, as questions related mainly to Katherine's career."

Questions ranged from "What made you take up a career in politics?" and "Why do we need a women's minister" to more testing questions such as, "What is your stance on fracking?" and "What is the biggest problem facing the Government at this time?"

Accompanying Katherine was former Priory pupil, Dylan Couperthwaite, who is now her Employed Intern. Dylan was pleased to be back at his old school and spoke about his journey of moving on to study Politics at Newman College and Lancaster University before spotting the intern opportunity.

Pancake Day Fun!

Tuesday, 21 February is Pancake Day (first Tuesday after half term). At break time on that day, we will be running a pancake tossing competition in the Assembly Hall.

Each house will need a team of 5 pupil volunteers and we will give each one a minute to score as many flips as they can. The house with the highest total wins the contest.

Pupils should put their names forward to the relevant Head of House who will select their team.

Mrs Cowell will provide the pans and the pancakes. We will have prizes for each member of the winning team.

What's the History of this event?

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Anglo-Saxon Christians went to confession and were “shriven” (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the “Pancake Bell” and is still rung today.


Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year but will always be between 3 February and 9 March. **In 2023 Shrove Tuesday will fall on 21 February.**

Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

A pancake is a thin, flat cake, made of batter and fried in a frying pan. A traditional English pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden syrup or lemon juice and caster sugar are the usual toppings for pancakes.

The castle consisted of two main components: the motte, an artificial mound with a fortified tower at the top, called a keep, and a bailey, which was an enclosure connected to the motte.

Pupils can tickle the ivories with piano lessons, strum a guitar, bang the drums, develop their vocals with singing lessons or play a saxophone - all under the guidance of experienced tutors.

KTB Music's Mr Madill has been teaching pupils to play the piano and said: "Priory's pupils are talented, they have picked it up really quickly. *Learning a musical instrument is important for memory, co-ordination, developing self-confidence and more and all the pupils who sign up to the lessons enjoy it.*

"We have everything from beginners to experienced musicians here and they are a pleasure to teach."

Lead Teacher for Music at Priory, Mr Taylor added, *"Learning a musical instrument and to sing gives our pupils an opportunity to express themselves, to be creative, to work hard at something and to persevere and shine. These experiences and achievements stay with them and can shape their future. They can move from the practice room to the stage and to the concert hall and at the same time be part of a £4 billion contribution to the UK economy."*

Chili Challenge Winners


Well done to Jacob R (Year 7) and Daniel R (Year 11) who are the first winners of our Chili Challenge.
