A Tiny Robot Makes A Big Impact for Priory's Estates Team

The purchase of a TinyLineMarker Pro X robot is the latest in a long list of investments for Penwortham Priory Academy, as more of the grounds and estates management is taken in-house. Mr Bolton, Strategic Estates Development Manager, says that the TLM robot will reduce expenditure, improve consistency, and encourage interest from more community clubs as the academy looks to increase engagement with the local area.

Following years of maintenance by both the local authority and private contractors, Priory made the call to get more hands-on with the ground's maintenance – boosted by a successful application through the 'Grass Pitch Maintenance Fund'. "With this grant we purchased a tractor, slitter, Quadraplay and mower meaning we've been largely self-sufficient for nearly a year now" he explains.

"In that time, we have welcomed three local community clubs and two neighbouring schools to our facilities which helps to generate much-needed revenue to drive further investment."



Mr Bolton continues, "With regards to line marking, we'd previously had people in to do that for us with varied levels of success and could see that having our own equipment would not only reduce cost and improve consistency, but it would also mean we could mark-out as often as we want and better accommodate the needs of those using our surfaces."

"Weather and growth dependent, it will be used every two weeks throughout the year – redefining our winter sports pitches through the cooler season, then switching to creating a seven-lane 400m running track and other athletics facilities over the summer.

"We're already seeing the benefits. We've managed to reconfigure the site to mark an additional pitch which is another asset we can now offer to the community. We've also been able to save the settings on the software for even more efficiency next time and have begun exploring the possibility of using movable goals and adjusting the

configuration to help us manage wear across the site during the more challenging months.

"The labour that this machine will save us will be immense." Mr Bolton adds, "The possibilities that the TLM gives us to enhance our own site and to offer the service to other nearby schools, is endless. It's helping to generate further income and investment and boost everybody's enjoyment of the surfaces we are proud to offer."

Priory's Anne Frank Trust Ambassador Meets Holocaust Survivor



Priory pupil Jessica listened to the moving story of Holocaust survivor, Anne Super, as part of her Anne Frank Trust Ambassador role.

Year 10 Jessica went to Pleckgate High School in Blackburn, along with History teachers Mr Eccles and Miss Ackers, where Anne was giving a speech as part of The Anne Frank Trust's partnership with the Fed. The Fed is a Jewish Social Care Charity which launched the My Voice Project, recording the lives of Holocaust survivors and refugees in their own voice.

Anne, who lives in Manchester, has had a book produced through My Voice and spoke of her life. How her first memory is of being in a cot in around 1941 and seeing green, the colour of the German officer's uniform. Then she remembers her mother crying and being rounded up with other Jews and taken outside. Her mother, knowing what was to come, pushed Anne through a hedge and told her to run and she was picked up by a local

milkwoman.

She never saw her parents again and knows they were taken to a concentration camp and were murdered. She lived with that family for several months and said she probably only survived because of her blue eyes and blonde hair but it was always a battle for food.

While the milkwoman saved her life, she didn't like Anne and Anne was soon put on a train to live with an aunt. A railway worker risked his life to take her and she had to sit on the top of the train as inside was reserved for Germans only.



Anne then went to Warsaw to be with her aunt, still hiding from the Germans, and she also almost died from tuberculosis. Then an uncle went through the Red Cross looking for his family and found his niece was still alive.

In 1948, Anne went to South Africa to live with him and, in her words, 'then life began'. This life took her to Namibia, Edinburgh and eventually Manchester. Along the way she married and had three children and became an optician. She didn't talk about her early life until recently when the Fed encouraged her to tell her story as part of the My Voice project.

Jessica said: "It was a really interesting speech. It's hard to listen to and it doesn't feel real until you sit and hear it. I enjoy being an Anne Frank Ambassador and hope to go to primary schools and talk about challenging prejudice through Anne Frank."

Lead teacher of History, Mr Eccles said: "Jessica has been on residentials with the Anne Frank Trust, she was specially selected to go on a course in Ambleside, learning about the Windermere children and going to the Holocaust Museum.

"Jessica is being mentored by the Anne Frank Trust and we were invited to Pleckgate to listen to Anne's story which was extremely moving."

How does it work?

Here's a reminder challenge works:

The challenges vary in complexity and all of them reference something called the persist lists. These are 30 words from maths and 30 words from English that we would like the pupils to persist in knowing how to spell and understand.

The challenges are set on paper that pupils can find above a special postbox that is in their dining room area. They take a paper challenge, reference the two persist lists that are displayed beside each postbox, and then have a go at answering all three questions. They put their names, forms and house on the piece of paper, and then post their answers into the boxes.


Every Thursday at the end of school, Mrs Cowell empties the boxes and selects a random winner for each year

group. She will also count how many entries per house have been made, irrespective of whether their answers are correct or not, and she will tot up that score too.

The winners are awarded each Friday morning and given a red plastic chilli shaped token. They take this to the front of the queue in the Bistro (Year 10 & 11) or Restaurant (Year 7, 8 & 9) that Friday breaktime and can exchange it for a snack such as toast, fruit, a drink, hash browns, etc.

The interhouse element is a year long competition to see who will have the most entries per house and there will be a trophy presented at the end of the summer.
