

History Pupils Take A Trip Back In Time

Last week the History Department led two trips to Lancaster for Year 7 pupils.

Pupils were visiting the city as part of their study of Medieval history and, whist there, they had the opportunity to explore Lancaster Priory and the Castle.

We were fortunate to have Andrew, a superb tour guide at the Priory, where he spoke about its Roman, Anglo-Saxon and Medieval history. He showed us the 14th century choir-stalls which are the second oldest in England - and priceless!

After some free time in the city centre, we then took a whistle-stop tour of the castle. The castle dates from the 1100s and is still a functioning court building although unbelievably, its time as a prison only ended in 2011.

Pupils got to wander the Medieval castle keep and the Victorian prison wing but it was the chance to be locked in an 18th century cell that grabbed their attention the most. Those brave enough to accept the challenge ventured inside the cell,

the doors were bolted behind them and the lights turned out, much to everyone's excitement!

It goes without saying that our students were excellent ambassadors Penwortham Priorv and the Academy, History department already looking forward to our next trip to Quarry Bank Mill with Year 8 pupils in Spring 2023.

Certificates are now available to collect during school hours by either the former pupil or their parent/carer and must be signed for.*




Any trophies, certificates and other prizes not collected during the leaver's celebration event on their last day, as well as the event programme, will be available to take at the same time.

School is only legally obliged to keep certificates for a 12 month period, after which time they are disposed of. If copies of certificates are needed after that time, pupils will need to contact the appropriate examination board(s) directly and pay to obtain copies. As you will appreciate, these costs can mount up.

**If any person other than the pupil/parent/ carer is collecting the certificates on your behalf they must have a note, signed by the pupil, authorising your consent for school to release them.

Seth said: "I have dyspraxia which makes things in life a little bit more hard work but I always try my best."

Reese continued: "It means his brain doesn't function like everyone else's. We wanted to fundraise and we have always baked. My mum has always made us amazing cakes for our birthdays and she bakes a lot of cakes for charity so it's something we have always done.

"We sent messages to family and friends that we had cakes for sale and we raised £160."





Seth added:

"This is important to me, it affects so many people and many do not talk about it as you can be rejected by friends.

"I don't like talking about it but it's important to raise awareness and my sister helps me do that and she talks about it which is great because I love her!"



What is Dyspraxia?

Dyspraxia is a surprisingly common condition affecting movement and coordination in children and adults. It affects all areas of life, making it difficult for people to carry out activities that others take for granted.

Each person's experience of dyspraxia is different and will be affected by a person's age, the opportunities they have had to learn skills, environmental demands and the support/understanding shown by people around them.

There are, however, some common signs of dyspraxia affecting movement (difficulty coordinating large and small body movements), organisation and planning (organising themselves, their equipment and their thoughts), and speech and language (difficulty keeping up with conversations).


PE teacher, Mrs Bullock added, "Millie is unbelievable! It is amazing to see that she medalled - she certainly

Over the next few weeks, the year group will write and deliver a speech on a topic that's important to them. These speeches are then delivered to their class peers where the best are chosen to compete in the final.



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
Assistant Head of English, Mrs Robinson-Ali, commented, "Pupils will have time to prepare their
