Drama Pupils Begin 'Scratching The Surface' of Next School Production

Priory's next play will be an educational performance in a bid to help people talk about the sensitive subject of self-harming.

Lead Teacher of Drama Miss Howell has overseen the more light-hearted musical shows at Priory of 'Legally Blonde', 'Matilda' and 'Mary Poppins' over the years. However, there was also a performance of 'Game Over' in 2022, which explored the dangers of cyber-bullying.

'Scratching the Surface' by Mark Wheeller covers the subject of self-harming and how it affects not only the person doing it but their family and friends.

Miss Howell said: "Drama should be used for educating people as well as entertaining. We do not like to talk about certain subjects, they are taboo, such as mental health issues and especially self-harming but it's important to talk about it.

"If we talk about it, people who self-harm may realise they are not on their own and that they can ask for help. We want to raise awareness and create a safe space to talk and break down the stigma of talking about mental health."

Year 11 Alex plays the author Mark who interviews Rob, played by Caleb, who as a teenager self-harmed.

Alex said: "I am not a big fan of musicals but playing this part was right up my street. I played a part in 'Game Over' too.

"I am Mark who interviews Rob about self-harming and his experiences with it."

Year 9 Caleb, who plays Rob, said: "I talk about self-harming, it is guite emotional and powerful."

Year 10 Ella plays Louise: "I am Rob's mum and I talk about it from a mum's perspective, about how it affects the family. It got me thinking about how self-harming affects other people."

Year 7 Ted's character is Ollie: "I am Rob's brother and I talk about how Rob's self-harming affected me."

There is also Year 7 Maci who is Girl 3. "This is very different to Legally Blonde which I was involved in but I think it has an important message."

Connie is Girl 2: "I talk about my version of self-harming and how I hide it. To me it shows how everything on the outside may not be what it seems. You never know what is going on."

Top Maths Pupils Achieve Gold in National Competition

Priory's Year 10 Daniel won a Gold certificate at the UKMT Intermediate Challenge and has been invited to the National Mathematics Summer School in Leeds.

The UK Maths Trust Intermediate Challenge is for high-achieving pupils in Year 9, 10 and 11.

"It's for our top achievers and it's an hour-long challenge, with multiple choice questions focused on problem solving," said Maths teacher Mr Hunter. "It's a national competition so they are competing against pupils from all over the UK."

Year 10 Daniel was the 'Best in School' and achieved 96 points out of 135 on offer and, after excelling over a number of years with the UKMT challenges, received an invitation to attend the prestigious maths summer school.

"It does look good," said Daniel.

"It's the first time I have been Best in School at Intermediate level. I am pleased with my score although it is frustrating as, looking back, I knew straight away one question where I made a mistake and lost points."

Year 11 Josef was the 'Best in Year' and achieved 88 out of the 135 points.

Josef said: "It was very hard, I want to do Maths at A-Level and do something with science and maths in the future."

Lily also achieved Gold with 87 marks and said: "I was pleased to achieve Gold as I didn't expect it. Some of it was very tough. I want to do Maths at A-Level as well."

Year 11 Sam also celebrated Gold while Alfie achieved Silver and was Best in Year 9. He said: "It was really tricky so I was surprised I did so well."

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Supported Internships for Post 16 (EHC Plans)

The Supported Internship is an academic year-long programme designed for young people aged 16-24 with an Education, Health and Care Plan, transitioning from education to paid employment. DFN Project SEARCH is a collaboration between Preston College, Lancashire County Council, Lancashire Constabulary and Hft.

The goal for each intern is to gain paid employment of 16+ hours a week. The programme provides real-life work experience placements within Lancashire County Council or Lancashire Constabulary. This is combined with onsite daily classroom sessions in employability and independent living skills, to help young people with learning disabilities and autism spectrum conditions make successful transitions to a productive adult life.
