## Lanyards

A reminder that pupils must have their lanyards. They are part of their uniform and teachers will be doing extra checks after half term.

All pupils are provided with an ID card which is attached to a lanyard in their House colour. These must be worn in school at all times. ID cards are used at the tills in the dining rooms to purchase food. They are also used to sign in when arriving late and sign out when leaving due to sickness or an appointment, for example.

Lost ID cards can be ordered and paid for via SCOPay for pupils to collect from the school office. Replacements are charged at £1 each which includes the card holder and lanyard.

# GCSE Revision Guides (Year 10)

The Science GCSE, either Combined Science or the optional Separate Science route, is perhaps the largest in terms of volume of content, hence the double (or triple) grade award. Having a revision guide as a regularly used point of reference and review is a step towards success. For that reason, we are now offering revision guides for Year 10 to purchase.

There are a range of revision guides available for each GCSE subject. We have chosen the Oxford Revise series as they include far more embedded opportunities for practice - from quizzing to exam style questions - as well as a more structured presentation of content.

When most people mention dancing many think of 'Strictly' but Lewis admits he isn't the show's biggest fan.

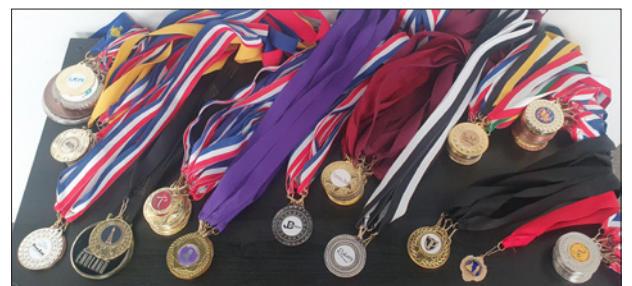
"To be honest I prefer actually dancing than watching it. My mates don't really say a lot about me being a dancer as I have always done it so they just accept it.

- collecting images from sources such as galleries, the internet, or books, and then using these to develop their own ideas.

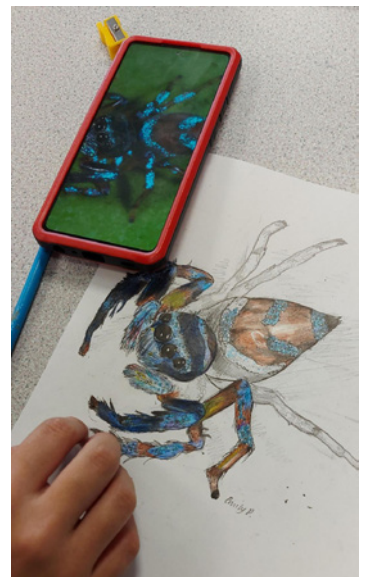
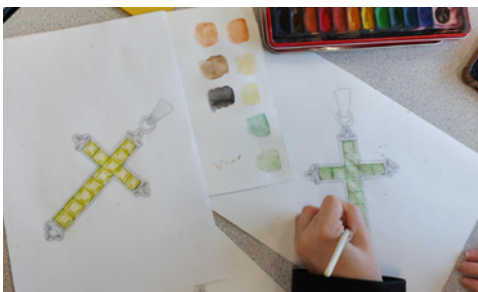
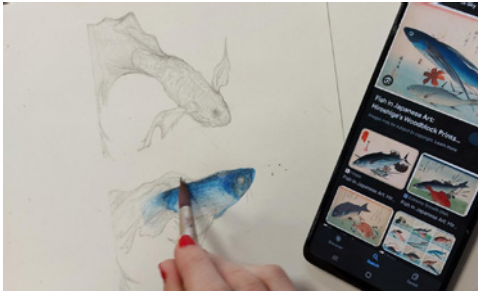
Artists and designers often produce several studies and ideas in order to develop their work.

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# Keeping Safe During the Bonfire & Fireworks Season



**Fact:** Watching fireworks is great fun for children however figures show that, more often than not, it's children rather than adults who are injured over the bonfire period.

**Fact:** Lancashire's fire crews are up to four times busier than usual around bonfire night, wasting time and resources on unsafe bonfires.

On Wednesday, 1 November all pupils will watch a virtual 'bonfire and fireworks safety' education assembly delivered by Lancashire Fire & Rescue Service. The 15 minute Bright Sparx session is specifically aimed at high school students and focusses on how to stay safe during the Bonfire period, the law related to fireworks and the dangers and consequences of firework misuse.

In addition, if you become aware of any potential planned anti-social behaviour, such as the building or location of illegal bonfires, locations where illegal fireworks are being sold (including to under 18s) or planned firework misuse please contact the Lancashire Fire & Rescue Service at [preventionsupport@lancsfireandrescue.org.uk](mailto:preventionsupport@lancsfireandrescue.org.uk)

- Don't set fireworks off after 11pm
- Never put them in your pocket
- Never throw them

## Fireworks, The Law and You

Fireworks can only be purchased from registered sellers for private use between:

- 15th October - 10th November
- 26th December - 31st December
- 3 days before Diwali or Chinese New Year

It is illegal to sell fireworks or sparklers to anyone under 18

It is illegal for anyone under 18 to possess fireworks in public

If you are caught with fireworks in public you could be given an on the spot fine of £80

It is an offence to set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am

It is also an offence to obstruct emergency workers

If you are caught committing any of these offences you could be given an on the spot fine or be taken to court where you can be given a heavier fine or prison sentence.

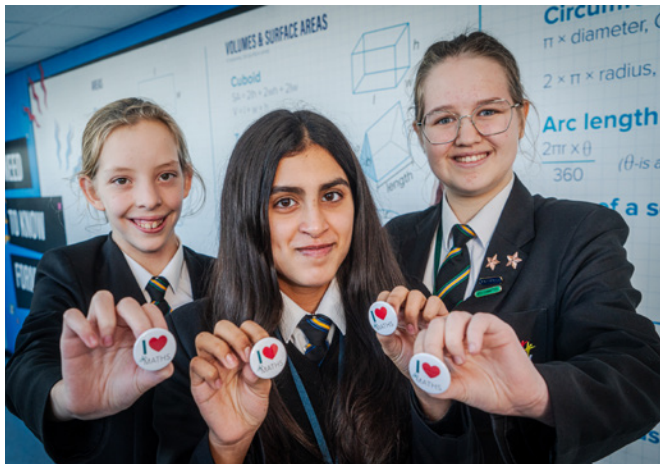
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Assistant Head of Maths Mr Sneddon, along with the Maths Department, are running a competition asking pupils to say what they particularly enjoy about their subject.

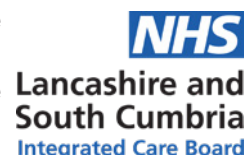
