

The PigPen cipher is a geometric substitution cipher, which exchanges letters for symbols which are fragments of a grid.



Did you know...

The Caesar cipher (also known as the shift cipher) is one of the oldest forms of cryptography, with instances stretching back long before it was first named. It is the most basic and

simple substitution cipher. It was used by numerous kings and common people in ancient times because of its simplicity. It is known as the Caesar cipher as he used a generalised form of it known as ROT-13.

Exploring Your Options After Year 11



What To Do When You Finish School

Lancashire County Council have produced a comprehensive booklet to explain pupils' options at Key Stage 5, when they leave Priory.

The booklet should be read by all pupils and their parents as it sets out information about individual school sixth forms, colleges and apprenticeship providers based in Lancashire

There are many post 16 education and training options to choose from and this booklet is designed to provide information about each of these. By showing what each institution can offer, this should help out young people to make informed decisions about their next steps, such as how to apply for a place, where to find information on courses and how to prepare for Year 12. It may also help those who have not yet decided on their next steps; those who may require further support and those who are at risk of dropping out of training or education once they finish school.

Although younger pupils can use this to inspire their options paths, they should bear in mind that some choices detailed in it may change and other opportunities become available.
