From Priory to the Olympics: Susan Cheesebrough's Inspiring Return

'Inspirational' was how our young pupils described the return of Olympic gymnast and former pupil Susan Cheesebrough to Priory.

Susan was part of the Class of 1976, then Penwortham Secondary Modern School, with several members of that year group also coming along to an enjoyable reunion, alongside former PE teacher Mrs Rhodes, then Miss Slater.

Susan found a love of gymnastics aged nine and represented Great Britain at the 1976 and 1980 Olympics. She met up with her former classmates last Friday and also watched a display put on by Priory's current gymnasts.

Susan, who is now a yoga and pilates teacher and a lifestyle coach, said: "I have been blessed in my life. I had a talent and used it. I was British champion and I got to spend a month in the USSR when I was 15 and travel around America as part of a professional tour. I have been lucky.

"It was sheer determination that I got to the Montreal Olympics in 1976 and everyone helped me on that journey, including my teachers and school friends.

"This is my first time back since I left school and it's lovely to come back. It's nice to meet up with Miss Slater again, she helped me a lot. There was also the deputy head teacher Mrs Lucas who supported me. Everyone at school encouraged me and believed in me."

Kathryn Shone (nee Dickinson) said: "It's so pretty with all the gardens. I liked high school – I think I laughed all the way through it. I have remained friends with people I met here and we still go out together."

follow our dreams was encouraging."

Faith Day Year 10 Thursday, 27 March

Over the year Key Stage 4 pupils are taught their entitlement to the Religious Education curriculum on what we call Faith Days. These are separate days in the calendar where pupils focus on a particular faithbased topic, led by Mrs Ham, Lead Teacher of RE.

On these days, Year 10 & Year 11 pupils attend their timetabled lesson and the class teacher will deliver the Faith Day material from Period 1-4. Period 5 and Period 6 will be their normal lesson.

Year 10's topic for the day will be 'Human Rights'. During the sessions, pupils will be given an overview of the topic, discuss some of the key questions about human rights and learn about what human rights actually are. Do all people the world over have



these rights? What are the different religion's views towards them?

In the Censorship and Religious Identity unit pupils will learn what censorship means, investigate the conflict between free speech and causing offence, and look at laws regarding freedom of religious expression and the conflict that this may cause.

Pupils will move on to understand the meaning of the terms Prejudice and Discrimination and the effect that these have on the lives of individuals.

Finally, they will examine the term 'Racism', look at the work of people who have fought against racial inequality and explore religious views on racism.

Year 11's Faith Day has been rescheduled for a later date.

Year 9 pupils completed a Google Maps activity – they had a close look at the cities of Nice and Marseille.







Head Prefect Chittara said: "I saw it and was interested. I signed up and, while I answered the basic questions, you also had to shine

with them and got an invite to attend.

Year 11 Pupil Gains

"My dad is an engineer and he talks about how great it is and I find it amazing that you can construct something out of waste materials and other engineering feats.

"It was four days in my own time. There were two days on site and two days on-line.

"The first day was all about what it's like to be an apprentice at BAE and the benefits.

"The second day was a site visit to Samlesbury looking at how everything

works and all the different parts of the company. I got to sit in a Hawk which was a big perk!

"Day three was learning about on-line interviews and then day four was the actual interview, which was stressful but I settled into it. I was surprised as they said I did well and came across as confident which was a boost.

"I was encouraged by how well I did. I want to go to college and study Maths, Physics, Economics or maybe Chemistry A-Levels as that should give me more options and then maybe do a degree apprenticeship."

Ms Smith added, "I am pleased that Chittara takes up every opportunity given to her. In doing so, she is gaining a wide variety of skills and experience by participating in these events and activities. I have no doubt that Chittara will go on to great things in her future and achieve all her aspirational dreams. I would hope that when she is Priory alumni, she comes back to us to share her successes"



Year 10 Trip Thackray Medical Museum 16 / 24 June






