Behind The Scenes: The Pastoral Team

In the bustling corridors and behind the scenes, there are dedicated teams who ensure that our school functions smoothly. From managing administrative tasks and keeping our buildings safe and secure, to providing essential classroom support and care for our pupils, these unsung heroes play a vital role in creating a positive learning environment at Priory.

In the sixth part of this series, we're shining a spotlight on the Pastoral Team as we explore their contributions and learn more about the people who ensure our pupils are in school, are safe, and their wellbeing is looked after, every day.

The Pastoral Team is probably the one which has grown the most at Priory, from one member of staff historically to a team of eight now, focusing on Pupil Well-Being, Attendance, Behaviour for Learning and Family Support.

They are a vital part of Priory with their main emphasis on making sure the mental and emotional well-being of pupils is cared for and the Pastoral Team will deal with any worries or concerns to make sure every child is happy, safe and equipped to learn. They also work closely with the Heads of Year who have both an academic and pastoral role.

Assistant Principal, Head of Pastoral Care and Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Crank, leads the team.

"We need our young people in the classroom learning and our main role is to offer the best support to make sure that's where they are.

"Parents may ring and ask us just to check on their child as they were having a bad morning and we can send them a welfare text back to confirm how they are.

"Or they may contact us about a uniform issue, to tell us their child has forgotten their tie, and we are there to make sure all these things are dealt with to ensure our pupils can just focus on coming into school to learn.

"Dealing with mental health issues is also a big part of our role and at Priory we have our own counsellor in Ms Lowe, Managing Director of Charlotte Lowe Psychological Services, who comes into school with her team twice a week for any child who may need extra support from a professional counsellor.

"We break down the barriers, or any anxieties, to ensure every pupil has the best experience in attending school and succeeds during their time at Priory.

Uniform Donations

Do you have any out-grown uniform that is still in good condition?

If you have any unwanted school uniform, including PE kit and ties, that still has good wear left in it then we can pass it on to families who need that little extra support.

With the cost of living affecting everyday finances, there are many struggling families who are anxious about buying school uniforms or replacement items. To support these families we are collecting donations of pre-loved school uniform which we can pass on.

You can drop pre-loved uniform off at school reception by placing it in the red collection bin in the waiting area. Alternatively, pupils can drop items off directly with the Pastoral team.

We politely ask that items are washed before donating.

Reception is open from 8am to 4pm Monday - Thursday (3.45pm on Fridays). The last day for drop off is Thursday, 17 July at 12 noon.



Year 9 Pupils Get a Glimpse of the Future in Al Workshop

Year 9 pupils who have chosen to study ICT or Business for their Options have had the exciting opportunity to dive into the world of Artificial Intelligence.

The hands-on workshop, led by Imole Ajayi from Loughborough University, was both engaging and educational, and offered pupils a glimpse into how AI is shaping our world—and how they can be part of that future.

One of the highlights of the workshop was the 'Intelligent Piece of Paper' activity. In this clever exercise, students played a game of noughts and crosses (tic-tac-toe) against what appeared to be a simple sheet of paper. However, this paper was 'programmed' with a set of rules that mimicked the decision-making process of a computer. It was a fun and interactive way to understand how algorithms can simulate intelligence—even without a screen!

The workshop also explored the creative side of AI. Students were introduced to Craiyon.com, a website that uses AI to generate images from text prompts. They experimented with different descriptions and watched as the AI transformed their words into unique digital artwork. This sparked discussions about how AI learns to interpret


