House); organising finances; networking and negotiating whilst considering external factors such as the school day, litter, safeguarding themselves and their audience; developing a marketing strategy and being ready to adapt if things go wrong – working through any challenges. They have all put their plans before Principal Mr Eastham, who has approved them.










Calculated Success for Priory at Maths College

To become a Peer Mentor pupils must attend two full day training sessions in school with external trainer, Mr Tahir Mahmood, where they are given an introduction to mentoring and 'buddying' younger ones.

Peer mentoring can support children and young people by:

- Enhancing social competence,
- Building security within the setting and wider community by realising their worth as social beings,
- **Improving** attendance and educational attainment whilst
- Developing friendship skills in a positive environment.


During the sessions pupils will develop their listening and team working skills, they will discuss scenarios that they could come across and how they can manage them effectively. Among other tasks, pupils participate in role plays and communication challenges across five strands to gain a 10 hour ASDAN accredited certificate. They also bag themselves a £25 gift voucher as a reward.



Ms Smith, Lead Practitioner for Personal Development, said, "In September we will have a Peer Mentor station in the Hex and they will be there for our new Year 7 pupils whilst they are finding their feet and have questions about our procedures.

"It is great that these pupils want to give up their own time to support our younger pupils. Not only does this course boost their motivation and confidence but makes the perfect addition to a college application or CV too."

Last week, we shared the news that Year 10 pupil, Taejuan, would be helping to launch the brand-new Foxton Youth & Community Centre in Avenham, a project he has been passionately involved with for over three years. We're now pleased to report that the centre officially opened its doors on Friday 20 June, with Taejuan playing a key role in the celebrations.

The opening event welcomed guests including local dignitaries, community leaders, and representatives from the Department for Culture, Media & Sport. Taejuan, alongside other young people who helped shape the project, gave speeches, led tours, and shared the story of how the centre came to life - from the successful £2.4 million funding bid to the design and development of the new space.

Taejuan said: "It was brilliant showing the MP, the Mayor and people from the BBC

and media around.

"I was very proud of it all and being a part of it. We were there for hours but it was exciting."

The new facility, located on Knowsley Street in Preston, replaces the original 1969 building and has been designed with young people at its heart. It features a kitchen, wellbeing and gaming rooms, a rooftop terrace, and a multi-purpose hall - all chosen and shaped by the youth forum Taejuan is part of. He also contributed to a video campaign early in the project, highlighting the need for a modern, inclusive space for young people in the area.

"We are now open to the public and it's nice to see the children come in. I have been volunteering with them and it's great when they come inside and see all the new facilities. We have attracted a lot of new people.

"My favourite parts of it are the gaming room, where we have an X-Box and a Playstation, and the sports hall, although it's bit smaller than Priory's!"

Taejuan's involvement has been described as "a testament to his commitment to making a difference in his community," and we couldn't be prouder of his achievements.

We look forward to seeing how Taejuan continues to inspire others through his dedication.

New Catering System Launches 2 July

Don't Forget Your ID Card

We're excited to announce the launch of a new catering system at Priory, going live on Wednesday, 2 July.

Pupils will soon be able to order their drinks, snacks and meals using self-service kiosks before collecting their food at the serving counters.

To use the kiosks, pupils must have their school ID card, which will deduct the cost of their purchases from their lunch account, as it does now. Without an ID card, pupils will not be able to purchase food once the new system is in place. A short grace period will be in effect, and staff will be on hand to support pupils with any questions.

We are urging parents to ensure their child has their ID card with them at all times, as this is an essential part of their school uniform. If a card has been lost or misplaced, a replacement can be ordered via SCOPay for £1, including lanyard, and collected the next day from the School Office.

As outlined in the Pupil Handbook, ID cards are also used to sign in/out during the school day, and are colour-coded by House. Please help us ensure a smooth transition by checking your child has their card ready.
