We're North West in Bloom's Triple Double Winners

Priory's gardens have once again been recognised as the best in the North West – and mentioned as leading the way for schools in the UK - thanks to green-fingered Mr Farron.

It's the third time Priory has won the Schools Award from Britain in Bloom North West - we won it in 2016, 2023 and 2024 - and the second time we have been presented with the Seedley & Langworthy in Bloom School Awards.

It's a double double as Priory won both awards last year. Mr Farron and Principal Mr Eastham attended the North West in Bloom Award Ceremony at the Bolton Stadium Hotel.

Chairman and Judge, Bernard Pendleton, said: "What Mr Farron has achieved is outstanding and the support from the Head and other colleagues is amazing.

"I think the school grounds, curriculum and community associated links are wonderful and the school is leading the way locally, regionally and probably in the UK, well done and what's more 'it's the garden that keeps on giving'."

Mr Farron said: "It's humbling to be honest. The competition is always very fierce and when the Head Judge made the introduction about the winner, I wondered who this person was not expecting it to be me!

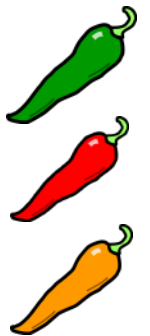

Christmas Jumper Day & House Colours Day

As part of our ongoing fundraising activities, in the run up to Christmas we will be holding two fundraising days in aid of Derian House.

In the forthcoming week, pupils will be educated on the vital work Derian House undertakes for seriously ill babies, children and young people across the North West so they become more informed about this charity.

As well as becoming more aware of Derian House, by taking part, pupils' fundraising efforts will also count towards their 'Priory+ Award' under the 'Future Citizen' strand.

Our fundraising will take the form of two days.

Christmas Jumper Day Thursday, 12 December



This is the same day when Christmas lunch is served and, should pupils wish to do so, Christmas jumpers can be worn with their normal school uniform on that day.

House Colours Day Friday, 20 December



As an alternative to wearing their uniform, pupils may wear a top or bottoms in their house colours alongside their own clothes. A hair bobble, wrist band, socks etc will not suffice. Those not wishing to participate should wear their uniform as normal.

For each fundraising day, we would like to ask for a donation of £1 - £1 from each pupil to support Derian House in return for wearing a Christmas jumper and £1 to support Derian House in return for wearing their own clothes with House colours on our last day. So, a £2 donation in total where possible.

There is a donations section on SCOPay where these donations can be made and this would be our preferred method of donating. Alternatively though, donations can be paid to form tutors or the school office in cash.

Faith Day Year 10 & Year 11 Tuesday, 3 December

Over the year Key Stage 4 pupils are taught their entitlement to the Religious Education curriculum on what we call Faith Days. These are separate days in the calendar where pupils focus on a particular faith-based topic, lead by Mrs Ham, Lead Teacher of RE.

On these days, Year 10 & Year 11 pupils attend their timetabled lesson and the class teacher will deliver the Faith Day material from Period 1-4. Period 5 and 6 will be their normal lesson.

Year 10's topic for the day will be 'Capital Punishment'. They will look in detail at arguments and counter arguments for the death penalty, referring to religious and non-religious opinions. What does religion have to do with the death penalty? Pupils will analyse articulately whether the death penalty is moral and the session will end by reaching a well informed conclusion.



Year 11's topic is 'In the End'. They will gain an overview of the topic of Life and Death, discuss the key concepts and examine some core questions.

During this session Year 11 will look at four key figures - from Darwin to Hawking - and what they believe makes 'life'. They will gain an understanding on Christian and Muslim views on the nature of the soul and what these two religions argue happens to the soul after death

Year 10 Work Experience

Priory has traditionally run a full week work experience placement for all pupils in Year 10. For the current cohort, the programme will run from Monday, 10 February to Friday, 14 February 2025.

Pupils will be expected to complete a self-placement, attend an interview and complete five full days of work experience.

On Wednesday this week, all pupils were given a pack with essential forms to complete and they must also obtain a copy of the Employer's Liability Insurance document.

Once a placement has been sought, all five documents must be returned to the school office by Friday, 31 January so that the relevant visits for risk assessments and the collation of paperwork needed prior to placement can be completed.

For primary school placements, pupils must not make direct contact with the school but instead provide a letter of application to Mrs Eastham providing the name of the primary school and explaining why they wish to carry out work experience there.

This is a wonderful opportunity that Penwortham Priory Academy is continuing to offer for all pupils in Year 10 and we would like to thank parents in advance for working with us to make it yet another successful programme.

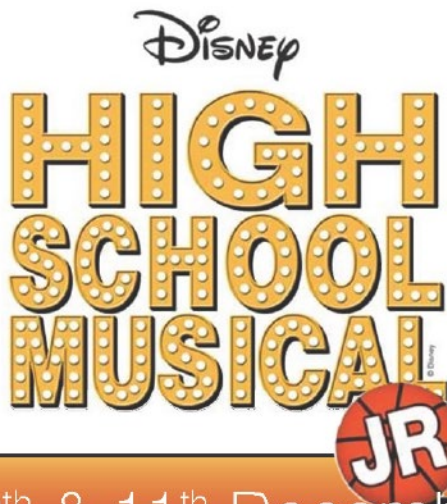

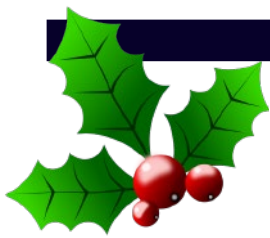

MEET THE TEACHER

This is the fourth of a series of articles where we get to know our trainee teachers. Trainee teachers attend two placements in the academic year so are with us either from September to Christmas or January to June. They initially observe then start to take over sections of lessons, leading to being in charge of several classes by the time they finish their placement with us. Along with assignments and studies in pedagogy, they work towards their Post Graduate Certificate in Education and Qualified Teacher Status by the end of the summer term.

This week we interviewed a trainee teacher who has been taken under the wings of the Maths department.

Meet The Teacher - Mr Flannery (Maths)

What made you want to become a teacher?

I was in financial services and I volunteered with a youth group and I enjoyed the challenge of working with young people. I decided teaching would be a more rewarding job for me as I would rather engage with people than sit at a desk.

I did my degree in Maths at NUIG (University of Galway), I worked in financial services for seven years, stopped that just before Covid and then recently came over to England to do my PGCE at Edge Hill.

What do you like about your placement at Priory?

It's challenging but also rewarding. I enjoy interacting with the pupils and also getting to know their personalities and interests. It's nice when something clicks and you get a real sense of how rewarding the job is.



The staff and the department are very supportive, they are helping me to develop and it's a good atmosphere at Priory. The teaching is a high standard and it is nice to see pupils make progress.

What's the hardest thing about your job?

Before I started teaching, I didn't realise how many different elements are needed to deliver a great lesson so it's about managing all those aspects. As a trainee teacher, I am trying to improve on the job.

What do you like to do in your free time?

I am into sports. I like playing football and also watching football, I am a Manchester United fan. I like surfing and also hiking and I want to do more of them.

Year 7 Go Back in Time at Lancaster Castle Trip

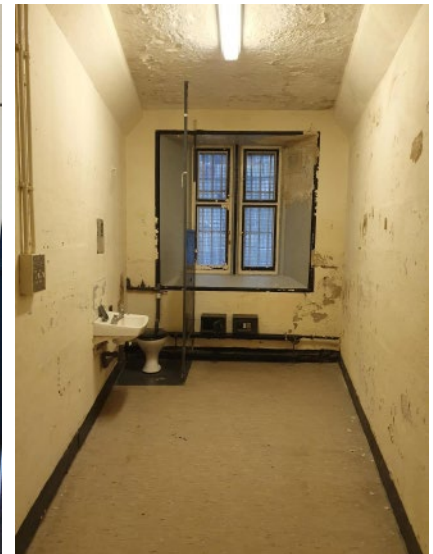
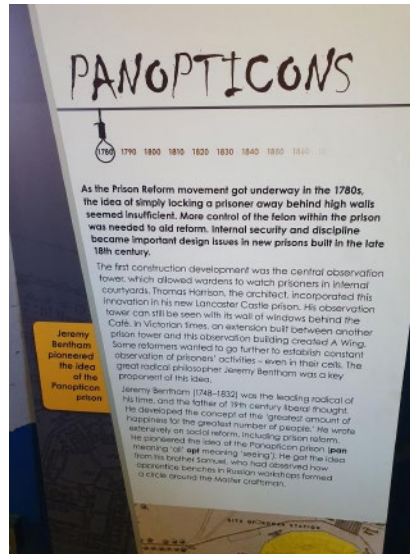


The History Department had an amazing three days taking our Year 7 students to Lancaster to visit the historic Priory church and Castle.
