Priory Celebrates Black History Month

Two of Priory's Head Prefects, Tarela and Hiylie, have planned a range of activities beginning next week to raise awareness of Black History Month including assemblies, food sales and music.

In the last school year Class of 2025 DaMari, who will be returning for the event, asked Principal Mr Eastham if he could promote Black History Month more at Priory, helping to educate pupils about iconic Black people in history and their influence. Now Tarela and Hiylie have taken up the baton and have been putting a lot of thought into their plans for this important month.

Tarela said: "We have discussed our ideas with Mrs Qadri who runs the Culture Club in school which we attend.

"We plan to talk in assemblies for Years 7-10 about Black history and also invite guest speakers in. I think people need to be educated on the cultures that are all around them and the history behind them.

"We will have a bake sale on October 17th where we will sell Ghanaian and Caribbean food which a group of us will make. We have other activities planned through the week as well."

Music played through the speakers at break and lunch will be from Black musicians, including Sam Cooke, Whitney Houston, Luther Vandross and Aretha Franklin.


Once the ordering window closes, school will process all purchases and notify pupils when they are ready to collect in early November.

English Department

Literature in Colour: Priory's Library Expands for Black History Month

Our library will be bursting with even more new books during this October's Black History Month after we received a significant donation from Eduqas and Penguin's 'Lit in Colour' initiative.

The English Department decided to change one of its core GCSE texts to reflect the modern day experiences of our pupils.

As part of this change, we received books for the school library written by a range of authors from different ethnic backgrounds.


English teacher and Head Librarian, Mrs Elliott said: "We looked at our curriculum and decided to introduce a more contemporary author into our Key Stage 4 GCSE English.

"There is plenty of room for William Shakespeare, Charles Dickens and JB Priestley but we just decided, for our Year 10s, to bring in a more modern author to reflect the current times.

"We are therefore introducing 'Boys Don't Cry' by Malorie Blackman to our curriculum which was written in 2010.

"In return, we have received a large donation of books reflecting authors from different ethnic backgrounds which is a big boost, especially for Black History Month."

The books are being launched as part of Black History Month to raise awareness of Black authors and issues which may affect our pupils during their daily lives.





Year 7 Inspired by Natural High Assembly

On Tuesday, Year 7 pupils took part in a powerful and engaging assembly led by David Graham. David is the founder of the Natural High programme, a nationally recognised initiative that encourages young people to find fulfilment through their own talents and interests, rather than through harmful behaviours or substances.

Delivered through a lively mix of music, competitions, and pupil interaction, the 75 minute session was designed

to be both fun and thought-provoking. Pupils were asked to bring a pen to take part in the interactive MIND Competition, and the atmosphere was buzzing with energy as David performed a selection of songs and encouraged pupils to reflect on their own strengths and choices.

Supported by Police Authorities, Local Education Authorities, Drug Action Teams, Councils and Community Safety Partnerships, Natural High has received praise from schools and education professionals across the UK.

Feedback from other schools has highlighted the programme's ability to engage students, promote positivity, and reinforce school values - and our pupils were no exception.

Ms Smith, Lead Practitioner for Personal Development, said: "We were pleased to welcome David to Priory. His message aligns perfectly

with our commitment to personal development and wellbeing, and it was fantastic to see our Year 7s so engaged and enthusiastic."

Mrs Farley, Head of Year 7, added: "The pupils really enjoyed the assembly, telling me that it was 'inspiring', 'fun' and 'really, really good'.

"There was lots of pupil participation and they were engaged throughout. They especially enjoyed the dancing and the games."

"The session left a thought-provoking and lasting impression on our Year 7 pupils, and we're proud to continue offering opportunities that inspire positive choices and personal growth."

Priory can now boast three 3D printers – and the 3D Printing Club pupils are impressed!


The club is for all year groups and meets every Friday lunch-time in Hex 1.

one, it wasn't enough.


"The new printers are faster to print and more efficient. They can also


print in a number of colours so the pupils

As such, attendance on this trip is compulsory for all Year 10 GCSE History pupils.

Pupils: Pick up your challenge sheet from the top of the post boxes in your dining areas. There are three


