Year 9 Discover Languages At Work

Last Friday, Priory hosted its latest 'Make Languages Work' event, a dynamic and inspiring day designed to show Year 9 pupils how learning a language can unlock exciting career opportunities.


As pupils begin to think about their Options, the event is perfectly timed. Head of Languages Mrs Scully explained: "This is the fourth year we've run this event, and every time it gets better. The pupils are so engaged, they ask great questions and really see the relevance of languages to different jobs."

Starting with a presentation from the University of Lancashire's TESOL lecturer, Karen Smith, on the importance of languages, the day was then split into two parts:

There were three workshops delivered by the Confucius Institute at ULan; two focusing on Chinese language, calligraphy, Tai-chi and traditional painting. The third was a British Sign Language workshop, led by Ricci Collins, who is hearing impaired. Pupils learned basic signs and communicated with Ricci through an interpreter, sitting in complete silence and showing the utmost respect throughout. This powerful session highlighted that language is not only spoken or written, it can also be visual and inclusive.

The second part was a career speed-dating session which proved very popular. The hall was filled with tables and the Year 9 pupils moved around to engage with each of the visiting professionals. There was a huge range of people available

to chat to about their jobs and the importance of different languages to their roles.

Visitors included Sarah Cutts Translation, specialising in Spanish and French legal and commercial documents; Mr and Mrs Taylor, who work in the food and wine industry; and representatives from the Army, who highlighted the strategic importance of language skills.

Pupils also enjoyed interactive sessions such as a drinks tasting with Mrs Bailey, using authentic phrases, and talks from Mrs Day of Penwortham Primary School about her experience of teaching languages.

Finally, Mrs Small, who leads the Japanese Club every Wednesday at Priory, spoke about the opportunities learning the language brings and the influence of Japanese companies in the UK.

Feedback from guests was overwhelmingly positive, praising the pupils' enthusiasm and behaviour. Mrs Scully added: "There was something to grab everyone's attention, and it really

showcased the value of languages beyond the classroom."

Year 10 Peer Mentors Ready to Step Into To New Role

Our latest cohort of Year 10 Peer Mentors has now completed the second part of their training and are ready to step into their new role as Year 11 pupils focus on exams.

The training, delivered by Tahir Mahmood and Gemma Appleton from Lancashire County Council's 'We Are With You', covered essential skills such as active listening, empathy, and problem-solving - qualities that will help mentors support younger pupils and promote wellbeing across school. Pupils also explored strategies for building trust, managing sensitive conversations, and encouraging positive behaviour.

As part of the programme, pupils have achieved an ASDAN qualification in Peer Mentoring, recognising their commitment to personal development and leadership. This nationally recognised award is a fantastic addition to their CV and future applications.



Peer mentoring is a key part of Priory's ethos, empowering pupils to take on leadership roles, develop confidence, and make a real difference to the school community.

Ms Smith, Lead Practitioner for Personal Development said, "This group has shown real maturity and enthusiasm throughout the training. They're now equipped with the skills to support their peers and contribute to a positive school culture. It's fantastic to see pupils stepping up to help others while developing their own leadership qualities."

Consultation on Updated Geographical Priority Area (GPA)

Penwortham Priory Academy is launching a consultation period to update the description of our Geographical Priority Area (GPA). This affects the admissions policy for the 2027-28 intake onwards, and a six week consultation period from 27 November 2025 to 8 January 2026 has commenced.

CONSULTATIO

As our local area continues to grow and change, particularly with the development of new housing and roads on land that was previously open fields, we are reviewing our GPA to ensure it remains clear and reflective of the current community landscape.

The proposed changes are modest and aim to:

- Align the GPA with more natural and recognisable boundaries, such as roads, rivers, canals.
- Include newly built residential areas that now form part of our local community.
- Improve clarity for families seeking to understand how their home address relates to our GPA.

This consultation is in line with the requirements of the codes and relevant admissions legislation, which at the date of this Agreement is section 89 of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 as amended, and Regulations under that section, Academy Trust Determination of Admission Arrangements.
