Priory's New Darts Academy Hits The Bullseye

While Priory pupils are dreaming about the Ally Pally and walk-on songs, the staff are seeing an increase in early attendance to school, an improvement in maths skills and a general eagerness to be involved in extra-curricular activities.

Priory launched its Darts Academy in January and we are only the second school in the UK to be affiliated with the Junior Darts Corporation (JDC).

The affiliation means Priory pupils can compete against fellow arrowsmiths nationally and internationally with a structured scoring and progression system so, as well as for enjoyment, they can significantly improve their rankings.

Head of PE and Sport Mr Bullock said: "I was blown away by the response, I guess it's how much darts is now on TV, but I have been amazed at how many pupils have come forward. Over 40 pupils have signed up and the interest is phenomenal.

"Being affiliated with the JDC means pupils have to calculate scores, track averages, compare data and more – skills that build confidence in real-world maths.

"Alongside the mathematical, speed, accuracy and strategic benefits, pupils will also gain opportunities to play against the best young dart players nationally

and internationally, representing the school and the JDC.”



“The school bought eight boards but, due to our affiliation with the JDC, Winmau, one of the market leaders in darts, support our academy so we have 12 match quality boards and full lane set-ups that have just arrived. The pupils have been over the moon with the upgrades, and now there is excitement to get to the newest boards with lights!”

“Our Darts Academy sessions are Monday-Thursday 7.45am-8.30am and so it has helped attendance and punctuality.”

“The pupils can also play at breaks and lunch-times and we have two sessions after school, it was originally one but we extended it because of its popularity.”

“The pupils have a JDC routine where we record their scores which is how they are ranked.”



Year 8 James said: “I love darts so this is great. My favourite player is Gary Anderson. I have a dart board at home and to play in school

as well is really nice. It helps with my maths.”

Year 10 Charlie is top of the Priory leaderboard at the moment. He said: “It’s good I can practise in school as well as home. My favourite player is Nathan Aspinall as he is local.”

Year 8 Bobby has already considered his walk-on



song. “I would come out to ‘Don’t Stop Believing.’ I do love the darts, watching and playing. I love the excitement of watching it.

“Playing in school has really helped me with my maths too.”

Harrison said: “I love the way Gerwin Price celebrates so he is my favourite. It’s great we can play darts in school. I don’t mind getting up early to come into school as I know it’s darts first.”

Year 8 Charlotte is the only girl of the 40-plus Year 7-11s so far signed up but she doesn’t mind.

“I have watched darts for years and I just enjoy it so it’s ok being the only girl. I like Nathan Aspinall due to his walk-on song ‘Mr Brightside.’ I also really admire Beau Greaves.”



BAE Systems Roadshow Brings STEM to Life for Years 7 and 8



An appreciation of STEM (Science, technology, Engineering and Maths) is an important part of our curricular and extra-curricular offering at Priory as it delves into so many skills that are desirable across all careers. As well as the academic skills it promotes creativity, problem solving and resilience. All of these were investigated during Thursday's BAE Systems' roadshow.



Years 7 and 8 took part in this assembly where they explored the world of material science from the tiniest atoms to applications such as Aluminium and Kevlar's use in air travel due to their properties. Pupils learnt about thermochromic (colour change due to temperature) and hydrochromic (colour change due to water) paints and using real life demonstrations they had hands on experience of this working.

The assembly also, importantly discussed different routes into engineering and other careers discussing both university and apprenticeship routes, very much emphasising that there is not one correct route, it is what suits the individual's needs the best.

The team who came into the school were very positive about our pupils and the way that they engaged with the assembly. We look forward to working with them again in the future.

Assistant Leader of Science, Mrs Potter, who arranged the event commented: "These opportunities are vital for giving pupils insight into how what they are learning in the classroom is actually used in the real world and how the skills they are developing are going to be instrumental for their future careers.

"Pupils can now use this event to add to their 'Bright Futures' section of the Priory Plus Award. It is great that this also contributes towards our Priory Pledge of enabling all pupils to be able to complete their Priory Plus Award."

Their class assembly last term was about 'collecting for local children' so they chose Barnardo's as their charity.

The Year 8s held two bake sales, a 'Guess the Teacher' quiz, Christmas jumper day and more to raise more than £400.

Mrs Elliott said: "We have far exceeded what we thought we would raise. My form has really embraced it. It was quite a vague idea - 'money for local children' - but my form researched charities and found Barnardo's. They put everything into fundraising and I am very proud of them."

Denise Whiteside, Team Manager, Lancashire Young Carers, Barnardo's North Region, said: "It's absolutely wonderful what the pupils have achieved."



"We work to help young people but young people are also helping other young people and that's amazing to see."

"We have a project at the moment where we are looking to start a cookery group in Lancashire for young carers, and maybe help with cooking equipment, so the money will be put to very good use."

Some of the money will also go towards Barnardo's Include Me 2 (IM2) scheme which offers an activities service at weekends, after-school and during holidays for children and young people with disabilities across Chorley, South Ribble, Preston, West Lancashire and Pendle.

IM2 also provides individual care packages within a group setting from its Lostock Hall base, helping children and young people access activities and develop social and communication skills.

Ben said: "We are all very proud to have raised so much, it's a great achievement and it's good knowing it will help young people in our community and they will appreciate it. It's interesting to know we have some young carers in school that this may help too."

Daniel said: "Fundraising was good fun, we had a good time doing it and we raised a lot of money so it was a success."

Matilda added: "Helping a charity makes you feel good, helping other people is such a positive thing to do."



Priory Girls Impress with Skill and Style at South Ribble Gymnastics Championships

Eight Priory gymnasts took part in the annual South Ribble Gymnastics Competition on Thursday, 29 January held at Worden Academy.

The girls were entered into the advanced category for their age group as they train over two hours a week at their local clubs. The competition consisted of two events, floor and vault.

On floor, the girls had to create their own routine compiled of six skills they could execute to a high standard, being judged on their control, fluency and competency of these skills. On vault, they had a selection of four types to choose from.

The girls came away with some great success -

Year 7 Heather L was awarded 1st on floor with a routine demonstrating a high level of skill including an aerial and cartwheel to back handspring. Heather also came 2nd in vault alongside Year 9's Imogen C who also took the silver medal position with a controlled and handspring vault.

PE Teacher, Miss Beesley, thanked all the girls who competed, and added, "All eight gymnasts represented Priory with outstanding skill and maturity. Their routines were executed with confidence and control, and the results speak for themselves. It was wonderful to see their training pay off on the day. Congratulations to every one of them."

Flashing lights on Pendle Hill helped Millie's design be crowned winner of the annual Year 7 Geography Contours Competition.

Year 7 pupils were given a project by geography teacher Mr Momoniat to create a 3D contour model of a landscape.

The competition was run in each Year 7 class, guided by their geography teacher, where they explored the intricacies of topographic maps and translated them into physical form.

Millie admitted she did have some help from her dad with hers!

"My dad and I love making models. We used Pendle Hill as it's easier to picture and base it all around that, as well as make it to scale.



"We added the flashing lights with a battery in the corner which makes it stand out."

Aleysha came second. She said: "It took me around four hours to make mine with wood, wood paint and wood glue. I enjoyed the challenge, especially as I like geography."

Manny, who won his class 7W2, said: "I have climbed Cat Bells, it's my favourite mountain, so my model is based on that. There is Derwent Water on it and the forest at the bottom. It helped that I based it on something I knew."

Phoebe came third and hers was an Eco-Peak, all based around recycling.

Imogen won her class 7W1 and said: "I used my imagination and made mine from polystyrene. It helped me learn more about contours."

Geography teacher, Mr Momoniat rounded off by saying, "Another year of fantastic Contour Models is in the books!"

"Our students did an amazing job sharing their strengths and learning stories, helping teachers better understand and support each student. This work has strengthened connections across classrooms and created more personalised, meaningful learning experiences.
