The gardens are starting to produce flowers in abundance now following efforts to support the school's journey from good to great. With Mr Farron's expertise, from taking cuttings and seeds, as well as using the bulbs again for the next phase of herbaceous growing,

the school gardens are now almost sustainable.

Mr Farron said, "We're now into November and still producing flowers which is quite an achievement. The vase shows off iris, gladioli, roses of the 'Dazzling Amber' variety and wild geraniums. We intend to use some of the petals from the roses in Food Technology for sugared leaves in confectionery."

Mr Farron's garden design is based on extracts from poetry and verse relating to the English country garden, ending this season with 'All Things Bright and Beautiful'. He is already planning his Spring designs based on a Wordsworth poem.



Year 11 Leavers GCSE Certificates

If former pupils were not able to attend last night's celebration evening, Class of 2017 pupils can now collect their GCSE certificates from the school office.

Certificates will be available to collect during school hours only by either the former pupil or their parent and must be signed for.

We would like to take this opportunity to emphasise how important it is that the exam certificates are collected, as they are very important documents that are likely to be needed throughout the future and particularly if a path to university is planned.

School is only legally obliged to keep certificates for a 12 month period, after which time they are disposed of. If copies of certificates are needed after that time, students will need to contact the appropriate examination board(s) directly and pay costs to obtain copies. As you will appreciate, these costs can mount up.

Tiya's Ruling The Waves!

From swimming to sailing, first aid to piping, Priory pupil Tiya Sherliker can do them all. Tiya, 13, is a member of Preston Sea Cadets and is already ruling the waves with a number of firsts.

Tiya was the youngest cadet to be promoted to the rank of Cadet First Class in her unit, having only signed up to Preston Sea Cadets in December 2016, and it was also the quickest time for a cadet to achieve such a promotion.

She has starred with her unit recently, winning a silver medal in the freestyle relay in the North West Area Cadet Swimming competition.

And Tiya has set her sights high – she wants to be a logistics officer, the right hand person to the commanding officer on a ship.

"I have always loved the sea," said Tiya. "My family have an armed forces background, as my grandfather was in the navy and my uncle was in the army. They had a big influence on me.

"I love the cadets, it's like a community and family on its own and you are treated like young adults and given responsibilities."

Tiya had to wait until she was 12 to join Preston Sea Cadets, on Strand Road, but has got off to a flying start. She has already passed various RYA sailing tests, she has passed Stage One power boating, she was one of only two cadets selected as a piping party at the RNA Trafalgar Day dinner at the Masonic Hall and has been selected for the parade team on Remembrance Day.

"I want to go to Welbeck College which will prepare me for the navy," added Tiya. "I have high ambitions as I want to be an Officer of Logistics. My friends do think it's a bit of a strange career but I have never wanted to do anything else. I am so proud to be in the Sea Cadets."
