A Week Full of Drama!

Mr Hardcastle, continued his busy month of Drama this week with a visit from Runshaw College performing arts students on Tuesday, followed by Devised Drama performances by his Year 11 GCSE pupils on Wednesday.

Priory's Head of Drama welcomed students from Runshaw College's Professional Performance Programme to perform 'Ricky's Revenge' for the Year 9 and 10 drama pupils. The Runshaw students were visiting Priory as part of their high school whistle stop tour across 15 local schools.

Mr Hardcastle commented, "The performance was inspirational showing the drama students at Priory the level they need to aim for. It was a physical theatre piece that was showcased along with the gestures and movement, which combined to create a thoroughly entertaining spectacle for all."

Jack Smith from Year 10 said, "Wow, it was so fast paced and I can't wait to use the techniques I've seen in my future drama lessons."

Wednesday evening saw the Year 11 group of drama pupils perform the first unit of their GCSE Drama exam. Carrying the largest percentage of marks, these performances are massive influence on pupils' final grades. Working in small groups, they devised an original piece of drama from a stimulus linked to a particular practitioner or genre as a starting point.

Performances with titles including, 'Blood on Your Hands', 'Who do you Choose?' and 'The Call' lasted between 10-25 minutes each, depending on the size of the group. Parents were invited to watch.

They created deep and thought provoking performances from a range of stimulus, which left the audience with lots of discussion/questions to answer. 
