Priory Recognised for STEM Commitment

We are impressive at supporting STEM - and have a certificate to prove it!

Priory has taken a strong lead in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects and our work has been recognised by STEM Learning.

We were awarded the certificate by the authority in recognition of the commitment of staff at Priory to STEM subjects and also of their work with STEM Ambassadors, people from industry who come into school to promote STEM careers.

Priory already has a strong reputation for STEM as one of our students, Jamie Edwards, became the youngest person in the world to create nuclear fusion aged just 13. We then opened our state-of-the-art £750,000 open space laboratory in May 2015 which has won praise for the way it encourages forward-thinking learning.

STEM Ambassador, Silas Adewola of BAE Systems, recently presented the certificate to science teacher Mrs Burns during their weekly STEM Club.

STEM Learning Chief Executive Yvonne Baker said: "The certificate is to recognise schools who are inspiring work with STEM Ambassadors. The STEM Ambassadors help young people achieve their full potential in STEM subjects as well as inspiring them to explore STEM careers."

Bobby's A Big Hit!

Bobby Green is proving a big hit at kickboxing but he has set his sights on making a name for himself in boxing.

Year 8 pupil Bobby, 12, won a silver medal last weekend in an international kickboxing competition in Bristol but may switch sports to further his career.

"I began martial arts when I was around four as my dad boxed at amateur level," said Bobby who holds a black belt in kickboxing.

"I started ju-jitsu and moved onto kickboxing and got up to brown belt. By the time I was around eight, I was training with adults."

Bobby is a member of Leyland NSK (National Sport Karate Association) and has improved by training with various champions they have at the club.

He took his black belt in December 2016 and admitted it was a tough grading.

"The grading can last anything from one hour to six hours and mine took threeand-a-half hours so it was a long process. I was just relieved I passed."

Bobby, who trains five times a week at the club and goes to the gym the other two days, impressed so much he was asked to teach juniors, despite being only young himself, and then joined the 'Fighting Squad' at the club.

"I didn't do so well in my first competition but then competed in an event in Bradford in the -45kg category for ages 10-15 and won. I got a huge trophy.

"I went to an international competition in Bristol last weekend – ranked the hardest competition in the UK – and lost 8-11 in the final but it was a really tough. I got a black eye and a bust nose as well as a silver medal and was happy as I am only 12 so am still only young in that age group."

While he enjoys kickboxing he was inspired by the Connor McGregor/Floyd Mayweather clash to change sports. "I think there is more money in boxing so that's where I see my future - I am determined!"







Ashley Hopes To Be On Target At International Competition

Ashley Brown is on target for success – as he has excelled at shooting in the army cadets.

Year 11 pupil Ashley, 15, was recently selected out of 1,000 cadets to be part of a team of eight to represent the Lancashire Army Cadet Force at an international shooting competition (CISSAM) in London this weekend.

Ashley was selected after impressing at an event in Liverpool.

"You have to shoot at targets and basically shoot in a cluster, so the shots are close together," said Ashley.

Ashley admitted that getting into the army cadets, which is based at Kimberley Barracks on Deepdale Road, has helped to change him.

"I did mess around but I always wanted to go into the army cadets. My mum said my behaviour had to improve if I was to enrol in the cadets so that's what I did and I love it.

"I have taken to shooting but I enjoy the other parts of it, like fieldcraft, camping out at night.

"I want to go into the army. My aim is go to Welbeck College and later into the military."

We look forward to hearing how Ashley got on at the competition.
