## Checking for Head Lice

Please could parents be reminded to check your children's hair thoroughly and regularly and treat if you find lice. May, Miya, Verity and Colin were chosen as they have all just taken their Astronomy GCSE – the youngest in Priory's history to take the exam.

The Hawkings family wanted 1,000 members of the public to attend the service and opened a ballot.

There was a separate ballot for schools as they particularly wanted to give pupils chance to attend - and these four Priory pupils were selected.




"It was a huge honour being there," said Colin. "It was emotional but it was also to celebrate his life so it was positive as well. It's something I will never forget."

A team of four Year 9 Priory pupils were invited to compete against teams from schools across the Chorley and South Ribble area to see who would be this year's Physics Olympics champions.


