Science – TBAT understand how to work with electricity safely.

Create a poster explaining how you should keep safe whilst around electricity. Use the internet to research any other ways or ask adults in your home ways to keep yourself safe.

English - TBAT retrieve key information from a non-fiction text.

Read pages 6 and 7 of our eBook on Active Learn, 'A Huge First Step'. Retrieve information and quotes that show the difficulties Neil Armstrong faced when in Space and while training to be an astronaut. Remember to use quotation marks when writing a quote.

PSHCE - To understand the concept of a balanced lifestyle.

Create a leaflet showing what we need to do to have a balanced lifestyle. Think about the food we eat, the amount we move and the things we do.

Maths - TBAT recognise the place value of each digit in a 4 digit number.

Think of a 4 digit number, label each digit with its correct place value e.g. thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. Repeat this 10 times. Now try to write these numbers down in size order from smallest to largest.
