



# Pool House Community Primary School

## PE and Sports Grant

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE, physical activity and sport in school.

Purpose of funding.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Pool House Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- employ qualified PE specialists to teach healthy eating and mathematics through sport
- employ our PE coordinator to continue this further and work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across school
- support and engage the least active children in physical activities
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities
- offer 'alternative' provision in after school physical activity
- fund places for pupils in after school sports clubs
- improve resources to support the development of the subject
- provide all children with team- colour t-shirts
- purchase school team kits eg. football kits, track suits
