#### **1939** - Petrol rationing

8 January 1940 - Rationing of bacon, butter and sugar

11 March 1940 - All meat was rationed

July 1940 - Tea and margarine were added to the list of rationed foods.

March **1941** - Jam was put on ration.

May 1941 - Cheese was rationed

1 June **1941** - Rationing of clothing. Also rationing of eggs.

July 1941 - Coal was rationed because miners were called up to the forces.

January 1942 - Rice and dried fruit were added to the list of rationed foods.

February 1942 - Soap rationed so that oils and fats could be saved for food.

By 17 March 1942, coal, gas and electricity were all rationed

26 July **1942** - Rationing of sweets and chocolate. Each person was allowed about 2oz (55 grams) a week

August 1942 - Biscuits rationed

1943 - Sausages are rationed
