## Appendix re. Current Covid Safety Precautions at Poole High School

One or two queries have come into school asking for clarification about the use of face masks. This week we have seen a number of positive test results in school. Thank you in advance for being so mindful of the continued risks and health precautions. Please continue with the advice: persist with Lateral Flow Tests; please do not send your child into school if they have Covid symptoms. The Governors have formally sought advice on the matter. Please note the following:

**Mitigation 1 (Physical constraints)** Unlike some schools, we have removed 'bubbles' this term to ensure your child has a better-quality education e.g. access to science laboratories for science experiments.

**Mitigation 2 (face coverings)** As Mitigation 1 has been removed, there is a potentially heightened risk. Governors have therefore made the decision to **continue with** face coverings in line with the government's expectations. Face coverings will be used in transition in the school where different year groups can come into contact. At the start and end of each lesson, students will be instructed to remove / apply their face mask. They are not required to sit through lessons wearing their masks.

This approach is consistent with the government advice: "The government ... expects and recommends that they (*face coverings*) are worn in enclosed and crowded spaces where you may come into contact with people you don't normally meet."

Students have been incredibly supportive and responsible about these matters. Please do not put us in a position whereby we need to respond to a child for defying a reasonable request for the short time they need to travel between lessons.
