Abbey Hill School and Performing Arts College is a large purpose-built special school catering for pupils with a broad range of special educational needs with cognition and learning needs and a specialism for Communication and Interaction and Autism.

The Abbev Hill Outreach Service operates from Abbey Hill School providing a service to all mainstream schools in Stoke-on-Trent. The Outreach Service is in addition to the 280 school places for pupils aged 3-19 with Cognition and Learning/ASD. The service has been developed to support the inclusion of pupils with SEN/Autistic Spectrum Disorder.

### **ASD Sensory Needs**

### Theraplay

Work based Theraplay activities guide practitioners/parents and children through playful, fun games, developmentally challenging activities and tender, nurturing activities. The very acts of engaging with each other in this way helps practitioners/parents regulate their child's behaviour and communicate love, joy and safety to the child. It helps children feel secure, cared for, connected and worthy. Theraplay will be delivered as a 6 week programme with each session lasting an hour. Come and observe Theraplay being carried out at Kemball initially and chat to staff about the package.

### Visual supports and objects of reference

This package includes using objects of reference and other forms of visual or tactile cues to support pupils understanding of daily routines and transition around school. We offer observation within a special school setting and advice and implementation within mainstream settings. Come and see how we use objects of reference and visual support to accommodate the sensory needs of pupils with an ASD or communication difficulties.

### **Observation of maths interventions and Numicon**

Kemball hosts three open mornings a year as part of the numicon advocate programme, facilitated by the Oxford University Press. Staff from mainstream and special schools are invited to book onto these via the OUP in order to see how numicon is used throughout the different Key Stages and abilities ranges at Kemball. Observations of lessons can also be arranged to observe multi sensory approaches and to share good practice.



Stay and Play offers support for children aged 1-4 years with learning/medical needs, their parents and carers. It provides opportunities to meet other children and parents whilst engaging in sensory activities in a rich learning environment. Our sessions include use of the hydrotherapy pool, soft play, sensory room, Makaton rhymes and sensory classroom based activities. Sessions are held each Friday morning excluding the first and last Friday of each term. Sessions to be booked and supported by parent/carer.

Hydro Poo

Watermill School is located in the North of Stoke-on-Trent and currently has 186 pupils on role ranging from 3-16.

Watermill teaches pupils with moderate and severe learning needs, challenging and complex needs and Profound and Multiple learning difficulties through a sensory and creative approach.

### Conductive Therapy within the PMLD classroom

Come and join us for a session of Conductive Therapy. The purpose of Conductive Therapy is to provide an inclusive intervention programme appropriate towards the pupil's cognitive and physical ability. The session is delivered using music, movement and specialised equipment. The needs of the pupils will balance towards the positive promotion and development of motor skills which includes: Fine/Gross/Body Awareness. Our PMLD lead is very experienced and is happy to discuss this programme further.

### **Developing skills for Singapore Maths**

At Watermill school, we have been developing an adapted Singaporean bar model approach to help our children grasp the basic principles of number at P level and early NC. Come along to see how this can work in your setting. Time can be spent with the maths coordinator to discuss this further.

### Hydrotherapy Fun

This is a water based fun activity to support pupils with a physical/sensory need, improve social interaction with peers/staff through water confidence. Target audience; pupils with a physical or sensory need in a mainstream setting supported by staff.

### Makaton Taster

This 2 hour package aims to provide a basic introduction to Makaton. This package can be tailored to suit individual specific settings.Target audience: parents and all staff who work with children/all key stages.

### **Observations of Early Years setting**

Come and observe sessions with our Early years setting at Watermill school where you will see a range of teaching styles using a range of sensory objects of reference, use of activities to aid interaction in communication and use of visual props. Time can be spent with the Early Years co-ordinator to discuss specific needs.

### **Rebound Therapy**

This package aims to target individual physiotherapy needs through the therapeutic use of a trampoline for pupils with physical disabilities; improve social interaction with peers/staff through physical movement. Target audience; pupils with a physical difficulty in a mainstream setting supported by staff.



Portland School and Specialist College caters for pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs (SEMH).

The school has 100 places for pupils aged 5 -16 vears.

Pupils are encouraged to develop life skills which will enable them to become more independent as they approach adulthood.

### Positive Psychology

Looking at the language used when speaking to or directing vouna people.

As part of our Behaviour Management Strategies Package we can offer individual pupil support and/or packages of support for teaching and support staff. Included in our behaviour strategies 'tool box' are twilight sessions at Portland School and Specialist College on:

- Managing the child on the Trauma Continuum
- Introduction to Attachment and Trauma -Attachment Awareness
- Introduction to Emotion Coaching
- Positive Psychology
- Behaviour Data Systems
- Choices maps/cycles

### Attachment Aware Schools Training

Looking at the impact of early childhood attachment and trauma and it's impact on development and resilience.

### **Behaviour Support Strategies**

Work with Portland School staff to develop your skills and knowledge around behaviour management strategies, Choices Maps and Choices Cycles.

### CPD

Opportunities for mainstream staff to attend staff training sessions and also to attend inset days at Portland School.

### **Emotion Coaching**

Alternative strategies for supporting young people with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs to recognise emotions and their impact on behaviour and relationships.

### Observation of Lessons with SEMH Pupils

Mainstream school staff to share good practise by observing lessons with SEMH pupils.

### **Providing Support on Teaching Assessment**

Working in collaboration with mainstream schools on supporting the teaching and learning of children with SEMH.

### Support Packages for Parents and Families

We are able to offer a fixed number of places on our parenting support programmes. These courses run termly and dates and times can be accessed via the School office. Our two Parent and Family Practitioners run courses/sessions on Attention Deficit Hyper Activity Disorder, managing challenging behaviours. Autism, Understanding Attachment Difficulties.
