



Clear and Simple Language

It is important to keep language clear and simple to promote your child's understanding. Too much language may overwhelm your child.

Using key information words will increase the chances of your child following the instruction.

Use simple phrases such as "coat on", "let's go".

You could also accompany the instruction with a gesture, a picture or a sign, e.g. When saying "Do you want a drink?", sign "drink".

Give your child time to process your instruction. Sometimes it may take a while for them to react.



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
