
## Using a Reward Chart



- A reward chart is aimed at encouraging your child to comply or to behave in a certain way.
- A chart can last for a week, a day or just for a shorter time than that.
- There will be a number of stars or tokens for your child to collect.
- The chart will specify what your child needs to do in a positive way, for example, "Kind hands" as opposed to "no hitting."
- If your child complies with the behaviour on the chart he/she will get a star.
- A full chart may mean a tangible reward/treat to motivate them to continue to comply. Sometimes just getting the star is enough. ( you know your child best)
- Children may use reward charts at home but bring them in to show their teacher. Their teacher could then make a fuss of them/ give them a reward in school.

Each reward chart is different. Ask school for help if you want more information.

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
