finished on a high, showcasing the skills they have learnt both this year doing their Silver DofE and last year when they completed their Bronze DofE.








The Silver group will now continue with their sessions after school before taking on their Qualifying Expedition in July!

The Bronze DofE pupils will be setting off on their Practice Walk on 13th April before doing their Training Expedition in May and their Qualifying Expedition in July.






Drama Production:
