## Herefordshire Schools' Climate Conference:

Eight Y10 pupils participated in the inaugural Herefordshire Schools' Climate Conference, which was held at the Herefordshire Council offices at Plough Lane on Wednesday 4th December. In the morning the pupils were involved in UN-style global negotiations as at COP29 in Azerbaijan. Each school attending was assigned to play the role of a country's delegation and tasked to prepare and deliver an opening speech. Pupils from QE played the role of the USA (Sebastian, Isla & Thomas & Owen) and Barbados (Liam, Georgina, Ellie-May & Neve). During a guestion-andanswer session they represented their country's views, addressed key questions about the climate crisis, and collaborated with other teams from Herefordshire schools. The COP29 negotiations were reported on during *Midlands Today* on BBC1, with Isla being interviewed and speaking eloquently about the useful-

ness and importance of the event. In the afternoon the pupils learnt about climate action in their area in a Climate Question Time. Local decision-makers from Herefordshire Council made short speeches on key themes, and the pupils put forward their questions to challenge the action being taken by local government to confront the climate crisis. They then met a range of Herefordshire Council departments in a *Climate Action Fayre* before feeding back QE's pledge for more action on climate related issues. All the pupils participating represented QE with pride, made important contributions to the event, learnt information for their GCSE Geography course, and strategies to help protect our planet from the clear and present danger of anthropogenic climate change.
